It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

1	SECTION 1. Title 42 of the General Laws entitled "STATE AFFAIRS AND
2	GOVERNMENT" is hereby amended by adding thereto the following chapter:
3	CHAPTER 149
4	RESTRICTING RADIO FREQUENCY IDENTIFICATION DEVICES
5	42-149-1. Restriction of radio frequency identification devices Except where
6	required by federal law, no state or municipal agency, or any subdivision thereof, shall use, or
7	request the use of Radio Frequency Identification Devices (RFID) for the purpose of tracking the
8	movement or identity of any student on school grounds, at school functions, or while being
9	transported to or from school grounds or school functions.
10	42-149-2. Civil action alleging a violation In any civil action allowing a violation of
11	this chapter, the court may:
12	(1) Award damages and reasonable attorneys' fees and costs to a prevailing plaintiff; and
13	(2) Afford injunctive and other appropriate relief against any agency that commits or
14	proposes to commit a violation of this chapter.
15	42-149-3. Scope (a) Nothing contained herein shall be construed to affect the
16	otherwise lawful use of electronic monitoring devices by the department of corrections or the
17	department of children, youth and families for individuals placed on electronic monitoring parole,
18	home confinement, temporary community placement pursuant to section 14-1-36.1, or in

- 1 <u>community correctional programs. Global Positioning devices are excluded.</u>
- 2 (b) Nothing contained herein shall be construed to prohibit the use of RFIDs for the 3 purpose of tracking students being transported to a hospital for emergency medical services in 4 accordance with section 23-4.1-1; provided, however, that no information that personally 5 identifies the individual shall be transmitted by the RFID unless HIPPA compliant. 6 (c) Nothing contained herein shall prohibit the use of RFIDs by a state or local 7 government for the purpose of tracking the location of equipment or vehicles owned by the state 8 or local government, provided that the RFID device shall not contain or transmit information that 9 directly pertains to any student. 10 (d) Nothing contained in this chapter shall be construed to apply to or prohibit the use of 11 global positioning system devices. 12 42-149-4. Use of radio frequency identification devices for toll payment. - The 13 personally identifiable information of persons who use radio frequency identification devices to 14 facilitate the payment of tolls shall not be considered public information. Personally identifying 15 information may be released to law enforcement agencies only for: (a) toll enforcement purposes; 16 or (b) for other purposes if accompanied by a court order. 17 18 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage.

1 This act would restrict the use of radio frequency identification devices for the purpose of

2 tracking the movement or identity of an employee, student or client as a condition of obtaining a

3 benefit or services from such agency.

4 This act would take effect upon passage.

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
