### AN ACT

## RELATING TO BUSINESSES AND PROFESSIONS - TRADE LICENSE RENEWAL SCHEDULES

It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 5-20-23 of the General Laws in Chapter 5-20 entitled "Plumbers and Irrigators" is hereby amended to read as follows:

5-20-23. Expiration and renewal of licenses -- Penalties for violation of section. -- (a)

All licenses of master plumbers and master irrigators and journeyperson plumbers or

journeyperson irrigators issued by the division of professional regulation shall expire on the

birthday of the individual qualifying for the license and may be renewed on or before that date for

a period of one year, upon payment of the appropriate renewal fee.

All licenses issued by the division of professional regulation for master plumbers and master irrigators and journeyperson plumbers or journeyperson irrigators born in odd years shall expire on the birthday of the individual qualifying for the license in odd years and all licenses of master plumbers and master irrigators and journeyperson plumbers or journeyperson irrigators born in even years shall expire on the birthday of the individual qualifying for the license in even years and all licenses may be renewed on or before their expiration date upon payment of the appropriate renewal fee.

(b) Any master plumber or master irrigator who fails to renew his or her license as provided in subsection (a) of this section may be reinstated by the department on or after the renewal date for a period of one year two (2) years, upon payment of the current biennial renewal fee of one hundred twenty dollars (\$120) two hundred forty dollars (\$240) plus outstanding

license fees and a twelve dollar (\$12.00) per month administrative assessment fee for he delinquency period.

- 3 (c) Every certificate of license of a journeyperson plumber or journeyperson irrigator
  4 issued by the department is renewed on or before the licensee's <u>second</u> birthday <u>next</u> following
  5 the date of issuance upon payment of a <u>biennial</u> renewal fee of <u>thirty six dollars (\$36.00)</u> <u>seventy-</u>
  6 <u>two dollars (\$72.00)</u>.
  - (d) Any journeyperson plumber or journeyperson irrigator who fails to renew his or her license as provided in subsection (a) of this section may be reinstated by the department on or after the renewal date for a period of one year two (2) years upon payment of the current biennial renewal fee of thirty six dollars (\$36.00) seventy-two dollars (\$72.00) plus outstanding license fees and a twelve dollar (\$12.00) per month administrative assessment fee for the delinquency period.
  - (e) Notwithstanding any other provisions of this chapter, any license issued under this chapter which is not renewed within two (2) years of the date of its expiration is deemed to be forfeited, and the person to whom the license has been issued is required to make written application for an examination prior to the issuance of a new license.
  - SECTION 2. Sections 5-70-14 and 5-70-16 of the General Laws in Chapter 5-70 entitled "Telecommunications" are hereby amended to read as follows:
  - <u>5-70-14. Renewal of licenses. --</u> (a) Application for renewal of a license must be received by the licensing authority, through the department of labor and training, division of professional regulation, on a form provided by the licensing authority no less than thirty (30) days prior to the expiration date of the license, subject to the right of the licensing authority to permit late filing upon good cause shown.
  - (b) The licensing authority may refuse to renew a license for any of the grounds stated in this chapter and it shall promptly notify the licensee of its intent to refuse to renew the license. The licensee may, within fifteen (15) days after receipt of the notice of intent to refuse to renew a license, request a hearing on that refusal in the manner prescribed in this chapter. A licensee shall be permitted to continue to engage in the business permitted by the license while its renewal application is pending.
  - (c) Every certificate shall expire on the anniversary of the applicant's birth the year following its issuance issued by the division of professional regulation to license holders born in odd years shall expire on the birthday of the individual qualifying for the license in odd years and all licenses issued by the division of professional regulation to license holders born in even years shall expire on the birthday of the individual qualifying for the license in even years. An

individual may renew his or her license by payment of the required <u>biennial</u> renewal fee. An individual who fails to renew his or her license prior to the date may not renew his or her license after this except upon payment of the <u>biennial</u> renewal fee and the additional fee required by this

chapter.

- <u>5-70-16. Fees. --</u> (a) The fees shall be paid by an applicant for filing an application for examination, for the examination, for <u>annual biennial</u> renewal, for renewal of an expired certificate, or for issuance of a duplicate certificate shall be in accordance with a section entitled "Fees", of the <u>bylaws of the board</u> regulations of the department of labor and training.
  - (b) All fee or other monies collected under the provisions of this chapter shall be paid to and received by the general treasurer who shall keep those monies in a separate fund administered by the department of labor and training pursuant to section 28-22-1.1. All monies in the fund shall be used to reimburse the board for expenses incurred in the administration and enforcement of this chapter. The controller is authorized and directed to draw his or her orders upon the general treasurer for payment from the fund, upon receipt by the controller of vouchers authenticated by the chairperson or secretary of the board.
  - (c) A holder of an electrical contractor's license, certificate A issued by this state who has submitted the appropriate application shall be issued a TSC license without an additional license fee other than that assessed for the electrical contractor's license, certificate A. This shall remain an ongoing practice and does not have any grandfathering restrictions placed on it. The TSC license shall run concurrent with the electrical contractor's license. The TSC license shall be separable from and is subject to enforcement by this board.
- SECTION 3. Section 28-27-17 of the General Laws in Chapter 28-27 entitled "Mechanical Trades" is hereby amended to read as follows:
- 28-27-17. Test fees -- License fees -- Expiration and renewal of licenses. -- (a) All licenses issued to the pipefitters/refrigeration technicians and fire protection sprinkler contractor/sprinkler fitters and sheet metal contractor or journeyperson sheet metal worker detailed in this section shall be paid for as follows:

13	SECTION 5. Sections 28-26-9 and 28-26-10 of the General Laws in Chapter 28-26
14	entitled "Hoisting Engineers" are hereby amended to read as follows:
15	28-26-9. Renewal of license Licenses shall expire annually or biannually biennially
16	on a fixed date or on the licensee's birthday, as the board may provide in rules and regulations.
17	Upon application, the person to whom a license is issued under this chapter shall be entitled to a
18	renewal, unless the division for a cause named in section 28-26-8 and upon notice and hearing
19	shall refuse renewal. Refusal shall have approval of the director.
20	28-26-10. License fees Each applicant for an examination for a license as an engineer
21	shall pay to the division at the time of application a fee of seventy-five dollars (\$75.00), and for
22	each license or renewal of a license a fee at the annual biennial rate of forty eight dollars (\$48.00)
23	ninety-six dollars (\$96.00) for a full license, forty two dollars (\$42.00) eighty-four dollars
24	(\$84.00) for a hoisting license, thirty six dollars (\$36.00) seventy-two dollars (\$72.00) for an
25	excavating license, and thirty (\$30.00) sixty dollars (\$60.00) for a limited license, these fees to be
26	deposited as general revenues.
27	SECTION 6. This act shall take effect upon passage; provided, that for persons born in an
28	even year, the provisions of sections 1 through 5 inclusive shall be applied to such persons as of
29	January 1, 2010; for persons born in an odd year, the provisions of sections 1 through 5 inclusive
30	shall be applied to such persons as of January 1, 2011.

# RELATING TO BUSINESSES AND PROFESSIONS - TRADE LICENSE RENEWAL SCHEDULES

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1	This act would amend the renewal schedules for mechanical, plumbing and irrigating and
2	telecommunications license holders from annual registration to biennial registration. The system
3	would stagger renewals such that licenses held by license holders whose birthdays fall on even
4	years expire on the license holder's birthday in even years and licenses held by license holders
5	whose birthdays fall on odd years expire on the license holder's birthday in odd years. This act
6	would also amend the license fee payments to reflect the biennial registration.
7	This act would take effect upon passage; provided, that for persons born in an even year,
8	the provisions of sections 1 through 5 inclusive would be applied to such persons as of January 1,
9	2010; for persons born in an odd year, the provisions of sections 1 through 5 inclusive would be
10	applied to such persons as of January 1, 2011.

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
