It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 42-72 of the General Laws entitled "Department of Children,

Youth, and Families" is hereby amended by adding thereto the following section:

and families. -- (a) Any person seeking temporary or permanent employment with the department of children, youth and families shall apply to the bureau of criminal identification of the department of attorney general, the state police, the local police department or the department of children, youth and families for a bureau of criminal identification check and a nationwide criminal records check. Additionally, any volunteer, intern or consultant of the department of children, youth and families whose duties involve supervisory or disciplinary power over a child

- 1 (b) The cost of criminal records checks required by this section for individuals seeking
- 2 employment with the department of children, youth and families and who are not currently
- 3 employed by the State of Rhode Island shall be the responsibility of the applicant. The cost of
- 4 criminal records checks required by this section for the consultants shall be the responsibility of
- 5 <u>the consultant.</u>
- 6 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage.

BY THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL

1 This act would amend the requirements for the criminal background checks to require 2 criminal background check which include fingerprints for individuals seeking employment with 3 or seeking to serve as volunteers and interns with the department of children, youth and families. 4 This act would take effect upon passage.

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
