1 SECTION 1. Chapter 5-37 of the General Laws entitled "Board of Medical Licensure and 2 Discipline" is hereby amended by adding thereto the following section: 3 <u>5-37-33. Restrictive covenants.</u> – (a) Any contract or agreement which creates or 4 establishes the terms of a partnership, employment, or any other form of professional relationship 5 with a physician licensed to practice medicine pursuant to this chapter which includes any 6 restriction of the right of such physician to practice medicine shall be void and unenforceable 7 with respect to said restriction; provided, however, that nothing herein shall render void or 8 unenforceable the remaining provisions of any such contract or agreement. 9 (b) Restrictions rendered void under subsection (a) herein shall include, but shall not be 10 <u>limited to, the following:</u> 11 (1) The right to practice medicine in any geographic area for any period of time after the termination of such partnership, employment, or professional relationship; and 12 (2) The right of such physician to provide treatment, advise, consult with, establish, or 13 14 seek to establish a physician/patient relationship, with any current patient of the employer; 15 provided, however, that such contract or agreement may contain such restriction within the first
