RELATING TO MAKING APPROPRIATIONS IN SUPPORT OF FY 2022

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1           This act would appropriate \$250,000 for the children's cabinet pursuant to chapter 42-72.5  
2           and \$2,500,000 for the graduate medical education programs, of which \$1,000,000 is for hospitals  
3           designated as level I trauma centers, \$1,000,000 for hospitals providing neonatal intensive care  
4           level of care and \$500,000 for the residential training program at Landmark Hospital.

5           This act would take effect upon passage.
