RELATING TO BUSINESSES AND PROFESSIONS - PSYCHOLOGISTS

It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Sections 544-1, 544-12, 544-13 and 544-15 of the General Laws in

Chapter 5-44 entitled "Psychologists" are hereby amended to read as follows:

5-44-1. Definitions. -- As used in this chapter:

4 (1) "Academic psychologist" means a person employed by or associated with a

recognized college or university or other recognized institution who is engaged in teaching,

6 studying, or conducting research in the science of psychology.

(2) "Board" means the board of psychology established by section 5-44-3.

(3) "Education" means the academic program pursued by a person in obtaining a

doctoral degree, that program to include formal course work, seminars, and practica.

10 (4) "Licensed psychologist" means a person who has been licensed for the practice of

11 psychology under this chapter. "Psychologist" as used in this chapter refers to a licensed

12 psychologist as defined in this section.

13 (5) "Practice of psychology" means the rendering of professional psychological services

to individuals, groups, families, or any public or private organization for remuneration.

15 Professional psychological services means applying established psychological principles,

methods, or procedures for the purpose of preventing or eliminating symptomatic, maladaptive or

17 undesired behavior and of enhancing interpersonal relationships, work and life adjustment,

personal effectiveness, and mental health. The practice of psychology includes, but is not limited

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1	(i) Diagnoses and treatment of emotional, mental or behavioral dysfunction, disorder or				
2	disability, alcoholism and substance abuse disorders of habit or conduct, as well as of the				
3	psychological aspects of physical illness, accident, injury, or disability;				
4	(ii) Psychological testing and evaluation of intelligence, personality, abilities, interests,				
5	aptitudes, and neuropsychological functioning;				
6	(iii) Psychoeducation evaluation, therapy, remediation and consultation; and				
7	(iv) Counseling, psychotherapy, psychoanalysis, hypnotherapy, biofeedback and				
8	behavior analysis and therapy.				
9	(6) "Psychology student" or "psychology trainee" means a student, intern, or other				
10	person studying or preparing for the profession of psychologist under the supervision of				
11	recognized educational or training institutions or facilities.				
12	(7) "Training" means the pre-professional or professional supervised experience received				
13	by the person at the pre or post-doctoral level, that experience to have been obtained in an				
14	internship, clinic, or other similar professional setting.				
15	(8) "School psychologist" or "licensed school mental health specialist", means a school				
16	psychologist that has met the criteria outlined in section 5-44-9.1.				
17	5-44-12. Application fee The applicant applying for certification as a psychologist or				
18	licensure as a licensed school mental health specialist shall pay pays a fee of one hundred eighty-				
19	seven dollars and fifty cents (\$187.50) to the state department of health.				
20	5-44-13. Temporary permit (a) Pursuant to sections 5-44-6 and 5-44-23(e) of this				
21	chapter and rules and regulations R-5-44-PSY of the Rhode Island department of health, as				
22	amended, a temporary permit to practice psychology under supervision may be granted to a				
23	candidate for licensure who has paid the required fee of sixty-two dollars and fifty cents (\$62.50)				
24	and has satisfied the following requirements:				
25	(1) Filed an application for licensure with all required supporting materials;				
26	(2) Met all the requirements for admission to examination, except the requisite number				
27	of hours of post-doctoral supervised experience, in a setting and manner satisfactory to the board;				
28	(3) Requested, in writing, the issuance of this temporary permit for the purpose of				
29	meeting the supervision requirement;				
30	(4) Refrained from using the title "psychologist" or <u>licensed school mental health</u>				
31	specialist representing himself or herself as a psychologist such other than by using the title				
32	"psychology student" or "psychology trainee or "licensed school mental health specialist trainee";				
33	and				

(5) Completed the requisite number of hours of post-doctoral experience within three (3)

2	(b) The temporary permit expires upon notice of passing or failing the examination for				
3	licensure. If the candidate fails the examination, the permit may be extended under further				
4	requirements established by the board.				
5	5-44-15. Expiration and renewal of licenses Continuing education Lapsed				
6	<u>license</u> (a) The license of every person licensed under the provisions of this chapter expires on				
7	the first day of July next following the date of his or her license.				
8	(b) On or before the first day of May in each year, the administrator mails an application				
9	for renewal of license to every person to whom a license has been issued or renewed during the				
10	current year.				
11	(c) Every licensed person who desires to renew his or her license files with the division a				
12	renewal application, executed, together with a renewal fee of one hundred twenty-five dollars				
13	(\$125), on or before the first day of June in each year. Upon receipt of a renewal application and				
14	payment of the renewal fee, the accuracy of the application shall be verified and the administrator				
15	of professional regulation shall grant a renewal license effective July 1st and expiring the				
16	following June 30th.				
17	(d) Every licensed psychologist who desires to continue licensure as a licensed				
18	psychologist shall present satisfactory evidence to the board and approved by rule or regulation of				
19	the board that the licensed psychologist has completed a prescribed course of continuing licensed				
20	psychological education.				
21	(e) Any person who allows his or her license to lapse, by failing to renew it on or before				
22	June 1st in each year, as provided in this section, may be reinstated by the administrator of				
23	professional regulation on payment of the current renewal fee, plus an additional fee of twenty-				
24	five dollars (\$25.00). Any person using the title "psychologist" or offering services defined as the				
25	practice of psychology under this chapter during the time his or her license has lapsed is subject				
26	to the penalties provided for violation of this chapter.				
27	(f) Every licensed school mental health specialist, shall include a signed statement				
28	attesting to the satisfactory completion of the renewal criteria for a Nationally Certified School				
29	Psychologist (NCSP) that shall consist of:				
30	Completion of seventy five (75) contract hours of continuing professional development				
31	activities as outlined by the National Association of School Psychologist's requirements for				
32	NCSP credentialing, within a three-year period.

2	5-44-9.1. Qualifications for licensed school mental health specialist. – An applicant					
3	for licensure shall submit to the board written evidence on forms furnished by the division of

6	(b) Has obtained a graduate degree in school psychology by an approved scho					
7	psychology program equal to or exceeding sixty (60) graduate credits with one thousand tw					
8	hundred (1,200) hours of supervised school psychology experience.					
9	(c) Has two (2) years or two thousand four hundred (2,400) hours of post graduate					
10	supervised experience in as a school psychologist.					
11	(d) Passed the educational testing service's (ETS) school psychology examination as					
12	determined by the national school psychology certification board.					
13	(e) Has obtained credentialing as a nationally certified school psychologist by the					
14	national association of school psychologists (which requires (b), (c), and (d) above).					
15	(f) Is in compliance with subsections (a), (b), (c) and (d) or (a) and (e) of this section.					
16	5-44-9.2. Requirements for a licensed school mental health specialist. – An applicant					
17	for licensure as a licensed school mental health specialist, shall hold an advanced graduate degree					
18	in school psychology from a regionally accredited college or university whose program of study					
19	was accredited by the American Psychological Association (APA), and/ or the National					
20	Association of School Psychologists (NASP).					
21	SECTION 3. This act shall take effect upon passage.
