SENATE RESOLUTION

CONGRATULATING REV. ROBERT J. MCMANUS, D.D., S.T.D. ON BEING NAMED BISHOP OF THE DIOCESE OR WORCESTER

1 WHEREAS, March 9, 2004 marks the day the Holy Father, Pope John Paul II, appointed 2 the Most Rev. Robert J. McManus as Bishop of Worcester, Massachusetts; and 3 WHEREAS, Bishop McManus is the fifth Bishop to serve in the Diocese of Worcester since the retirement of The Most Rev. Daniel P. Reilly, ironically enough, Bishop Reilly is also a 4 Rhode Island native; and 5 WHEREAS, In the last five years, Bishop McManus has been the Auxiliary Bishop of 6 7 Providence, RI serving God's people next to his Excellency Bishop Mulvee. There will be a 8 farewell mass for Bishop McManus in early May, allowing all who have been so positively 9 impacted by his holiness, to wish him well; and 10 WHEREAS, Although bittersweet, Bishop McManus accepted, without hesitation, to be the next Bishop of the Diocese of Worcester. Rhode Island is his home and will always hold a 11 12 warm place in his heart. He states that "with a tranquility of spirit that comes from believing that 13 'for those who love God everything works together for the good'". He answers to a higher calling, 14 one he received as a young child growing up with a strong Catholic faith and education; and 15 WHEREAS, The Most Rev. McManus graduated from Blessed Sacrament School in 16 Providence and Our Lady of Providence Seminary High School. Our Lady of Providence 17 Seminary in Warwick is where he studied for the priesthood. He continued on to The Catholic 18 University of America in Washington, D.C. earning a Bachelors and Master of Arts degree and

the Toronto School of Theology earning a Master of Divinity degree. In addition, he earned

1 licentiate and doctoral degrees in sacred theology from the Pontifical Gregorian University in

3 WHEREAS, Before Bishop McManus' ordination to the priesthood, he performed a 4 year's deaconal service at Our Lady of Mercy Parish in East Greenwich. He was ordained on May 27, 1978 by Bishop Kenneth A. Angell. After his ordination, he served as temporary 5 6 assistant chaplain at St. Joseph's Hospital (1978), Associate Pastor at St. Matthew's Parish in 7 Cranston (1978-1981) as Associate Pastor at St. Anthony's Parish in Providence (1981-1982). 8 While he continued in residence at St. Anthony, he served as the Catholic Chaplain at the 9 Community College of Rhode Island from 1982 to 1984; and 10 WHEREAS, While in Rome pursuing advanced studies in theology, Bishop McManus 11 was named director of the Diocesan Office of Ministerial Formation from July 1, 1986, to July 12 1987 then returning to the diocese to take up residence at St. Luke's Parish in Barrington. 13 November 9, 1987 he became diocesan Vicar for Education, the same year he acted as Director of 14 the Office of Ministerial Formation and in-residence at St. Luke's; and 15 WHEREAS, The Most Rev. McManus was able to assume additional duties, taking the position of theological consultant and editorial writer for The Providence Visitor newspaper. On 16 17 February 28, 1997 he was appointed a Prelate of Honor to His Holiness with the title of 18 Monsignor; and 19 WHEREAS, This influx of successes would seem far reached for most, but Bishop 20 McManus has been on a mission assuming a tremendous amount of responsibilities, however 21 great, to ultimately serve the will of God. He was named Rector of Our Lady of Providence 22 Seminary on June 26, 1998 at the same time continuing his duties as Vicar for Education and 23 Director of Ministerial Formation and assumed responsibility for weekend assistance at St. 24 Margaret's Parish in Rumford. In conjunction, he was ordained as Titular Bishop of Allegheny 25 and Auxiliary Bishop of Providence on February 22, 1999 and his duty to serve as Secretary for 26 Ministerial Formation and Rector of Our Lady of Providence Seminary continued; and 27 WHEREAS, Although the news of Bishop McManus' Holy Father's appointment brings 28 tremendous joy and admiration, Bishop Mulvee is also saddened with the news. He is quoted as 29 saying "the news brings mixed emotions". Certainly, with all his friends in our state of Rhode 30 Island and beyond, we offer Bishop McManus our warmest, prayerful congratulations. We 31 rejoice that the Holy Father has recognized his gifts and talents and entrusted the Diocese of 32 Worcester to his care. While his appointment is a blessing for Worcester, this native born Rhode Islander, this dedicated son of the Diocese of Providence will truly be missed here; now, therefore 33
