# RELATING TO STATE AFFAIRS AND GOVERNMENT -- RHODE ISLAND HOUSING RESOURCES ACT OF 1998

Introduced By: Representatives Slater, Diaz, and Tanzi

It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 42-128-8 of the General Laws in Chapter 42-128 entitled "Rhode

Island Housing Resources Act of 1998" is hereby amended to read as follows:

3 <u>42-128-8. Powers and duties. --</u> In order to provide housing opportunities for all Rhode

4 Islanders, to maintain the quality of housing in Rhode Island, and to coordinate and make

effective the housing responsibilities of the agencies and subdivisions of the state, the

commission shall have the following powers and duties:

(1) Policy, planning and coordination of state housing functions. - The commission shall

8 have the power and duty:

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(i) To prepare and adopt the state's plans for housing; provided, however, that this

provision shall not be interpreted to contravene the prerogative of the state planning council to

adopt a state guide plan for housing.

(ii) To prepare, adopt, and issue the state's housing policy.

13 (iii) To conduct research on and make reports regarding housing issues in the state.

14 (iv) To advise the governor and general assembly on housing issues and to coordinate

15 housing activities among government agencies and agencies created by state law or providing

housing services under government programs.

(2) Establish, implement, and monitor state performance measures and guidelines for

18 housing programs. - The commission shall have the power and the duty:

1	(1) To promutgate performance measures and guidennes for mousing programs conducted
2	under state law.
3	(ii) To monitor and evaluate housing responsibilities established by state law, and to
4	establish a process for annual reporting on the outcomes of the programs and investments of the
5	state in housing for low and moderate income people.
6	(iii) To hear and resolve disputes pertaining to housing issues.
7	(3) Administer the programs pertaining to housing resources that may be assigned by
8	state law The commission shall have the power and duty to administer programs for housing,
9	housing services, and community development, including, but not limited to, programs pertaining
10	to:
11	(i) Abandoned properties and the remediation of blighting conditions.
12	(ii) Lead abatement and to manage a lead hazard abatement program in cooperation with
13	the Rhode Island housing and mortgage finance corporation.
14	(iii) Services for the homeless.
15	(iv) Rental assistance.
16	(v) Community development.
17	(vi) Outreach, education and technical assistance services.
18	(vii) Assistance, including financial support, to non-profit organizations and community
19	development corporations.
20	(viii) Tax credits that assist in the provision of housing or foster community development
21	or that result in support to non-profit organizations performing functions to accomplish the
22	purposes of this chapter.
23	(ix) The Supportive Services Program, the purpose of which is to help prevent and end
24	homelessness among those who have experienced long-term homelessness and for whom certain
25	services in addition to housing are essential. State funding for this program may leverage other
26	resources for the purpose of providing supportive services. Services provided pursuant to this
27	subsection may include, but not be limited to: assistance with budgeting and paying rent; access
28	to employment; encouraging tenant involvement in facility management and policies; medication
29	monitoring and management; daily living skills related to food, housekeeping and socialization;
30	counseling to support self-identified goals; referrals to mainstream health, mental health and
31	treatment programs; and conflict resolution.
32	(x) The neighborhood opportunities program, the purpose of which shall be to address the
33	housing and revitalization needs of the state's deteriorating neighborhoods. The neighborhood
34	opportunities program shall provide financial assistance to implement the following three (3)

2	(A) The family affordable housing program, the purpose of which shall be to produce an
3	additional supply of housing units at rents affordable to families working at or near minimum
4	wage. State funding will leverage other resources for the production of housing, to create mixed
5	income housing, and to revitalize neighborhoods through the rehabilitation of existing
6	substandard units.
7	(B) The permanent supportive housing program, the purpose of which shall be to produce
8	additional housing for disabled individuals to be coupled with services and case management to
9	stabilize homeless individuals in permanent housing at affordable rents for persons receiving
10	supplemental social security income (SSI).
11	(C) The neighborhood revitalization program, the purpose of which shall be to provide
12	grants to local communities for renovation, demolition, and homeownership opportunities in
13	neighborhoods designated for revitalization.
14	SECTION 2. There is hereby appropriated out of a dedicated funding stream of money in
15	the treasury appropriated for the fiscal year 2012-2013, the sum of twelve million, five hundred
16	thousand dollars (\$12,500,000) for the purpose of carrying out the provisions of this act, and the
17	state controller is hereby authorized to draw his orders upon the general treasurer for the payment
18	of said sum, or so much thereof as may be from time to time required, upon receipt by him/her of
19	properly authenticated vouchers.
20	SECTION 3. At the general election to be held on the Tuesday next after the first
21	Monday in November 2012, there shall be submitted to the people for their approval or rejection
22	the following proposition:
23	"Shall the action of the general assembly, by an act passed by the January 2012 session
24	authorizing the issuance of bonds, refunding bonds, and temporary notes of the state of Rhode
25	Island in the amount of seventy-five million dollars (\$75,000,000) to provide funds to the
26	Housing Resources Commission to be allocated to finance the cost of the Neighborhood
27	Opportunities Program be approved, and the issuance of such bonds, refunding bonds, and
28	temporary notes in accordance with the act be authorized?"
29	SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage.
