## AN ACT

#### RELATING TO CRIMINAL OFFENSES -- WEAPONS

It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

1	SECTION 1. Sections 11-47-60 and 11-47-60.2 of the General Laws in Chapter 11-47
2	entitled "Weapons" are hereby amended to read as follows:
3	11-47-60. Possession of firearms on school grounds (a) (1) No person shall have in
4	his or her possession any firearm or other weapons on school grounds.
5	(2) For the purposes of this section, "school grounds" means the property of a public or
6	private elementary or secondary school or in those portions of any building, stadium, or other
7	structure on school grounds which were, at the time of the violation, being used for an activity
8	sponsored by or through a school in this state or while riding school provided transportation.
9	(3) For the purposes of this section, "weapon" shall include a knife of any length that has
10	the capability to cut or stab another.
11	(3)(4) Every person violating the provisions of this section shall, upon conviction, be
12	sentenced to imprisonment for not less than one year nor more than five (5) years, or shall be
13	fined not less than five hundred dollars (\$500) nor more than five thousand dollars (\$5,000).
14	(4)(5) Any juvenile adjudicated delinquent pursuant to this statute shall, in addition to
15	whatever other penalties are imposed by the family court, lose his or her license to operate a
16	motor vehicle for up to six (6) months. If the juvenile has not yet obtained the necessary age to
17	obtain a license, the court may impose as part of its sentence a delay in his or her right to obtain
18	the license when eligible to do so, for a period of up to six (6) months.

(b) The provisions of this section shall not apply to any person who shall be exempt

1	pursuant to the provisions of sections 11-47-9, 11-47-11, and 11-47-18 or to the following
2	activities when the activities are officially recognized and sanctioned by the educational
3	institution:
4	(1) Firearm instruction and/or safety courses;
5	(2) Government-sponsored military-related programs such as ROTC;
6	(3) Interscholastic shooting and/or marksmanship events;
7	(4) Military history and firearms collection courses and/or programs; and
8	(5) The use of blank guns in theatrical and/or athletic events.
9	(c) The provisions of this section shall not apply to colleges, universities, or junior
10	colleges.
11	11-47-60.2. Possession of weapons on school grounds Notification (a) If a student
12	is found to be carrying a weapon, as defined in section 11-47-42, a firearm or replica of a firearm,
13	or commits an aggravated assault on school grounds as defined in section 11-47-60, the principal
14	or designee shall immediately notify the student's parents and the local police and turn the
15	weapon over, if any, to the local enforcement agency.
16	(b) For the purposes of this section, "weapon" shall include a knife of any length that has
17	the capability to cut or stab another.
18	(b)(c) Any person who has reasonable cause to know that any person is in violation of
19	this statute shall notify the principal or designee. The principal or designee shall immediately
20	notify the student's parents and the local police. Any person acting in good faith who makes a
21	report under this section shall have immunity from any civil liability that might otherwise be
22	incurred or imposed as a result of making the report.
23	(e)(d) School superintendents shall receive notice from the clerk of the family court
24	regarding the disposition of all cases involving juveniles from their school districts adjudged
25	pursuant to this statute. This information shall remain confidential and be shared with school
26	officials who deal directly with the student.
27	(d)(e) The provisions of this section should not apply to the following activities when the
28	activities are officially recognized and sanctioned by the educational institution:
29	(1) Firearm instructed and/or safety course;
30	(2) Government-sponsored military-related programs such as ROTC;
31	(3) Interscholastic shooting and/or marksmanship events;
32	(4) Military history and firearms collection courses and/or programs; and
33	(5) The use of blank guns in theatrical and/or athletic events.
34	(e) The provisions of this section shall not apply to colleges, universities or junior
