It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

- SECTION 1. Chapter 42-61 of the General Laws entitled "State Lottery" is hereby
  amended by adding thereto the following section:
- 3 <u>42-61-19. Scratch-A-Tick Game. During the fiscal year ending June 30, 2013 the state</u>
- 4 lottery division within the department of revenue shall conduct, in conformity with the applicable
- 5 provisions of chapter 42-61 of the general laws, an instant game to be known as "Scratch-A-Tick
- 6 Game." The lesser of either the net revenue from the first three (3) months of the running of the
- 7 "Scratch-A-Tick Game" or two hundred thousand dollars (\$200,000) shall be deposited in a
- 8 restricted revenue account to be used by the University of Rhode Island Center for Vector-Borne
- 9 Disease and Tick Encounter Resource Center for tick-bite protection and disease prevention
- 10 research and outreach. The provisions of this section shall prevail over any provisions of chapter
- 11 <u>42-61 which are inconsistent therewith.</u>
- 12 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage.

1 This act would direct the state lottery division to conduct an instant game known as the 2 "Scratch-A-Tick Game" during the fiscal year ending June 30, 2013. The lesser amount of either 3 the net revenue from the first three (3) months of the running of said game or two hundred 4 thousand dollars (\$200,000) shall be deposited in a restricted revenue account to be used by the 5 University of Rhode Island for Vector-Borne Disease and Tick Encounter Resource Center to 6 help support statewide tick-bite protection and Lyme disease prevention research and outreach. 7 This act would take effect upon passage.
