It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

1	SECTION 1. Title 23 of the General Laws entitled "HEALTH AND SAFETY" is hereby
2	amended by adding thereto the following chapter:
3	CHAPTER 24.11
4	COMPREHENSIVE CHILDREN'S JEWELRY SAFETY ACT
5	23-24.11-1. Short title This act shall be known and may be cited as the
6	"Comprehensive Children's Jewelry Safety Act."
7	23-24.11-2. Definitions. – (a) "Children's jewelry" means jewelry designed or intended
8	primarily for use by children twelve (12) years of age or younger to be worn as an item of
9	personal ornamentation, and does not include:
10	(1) Toys or other products intended for use when a child plays;
11	(2) Accessories;
12	(3) Apparel:
13	(4) Footwear; or
14	(5) Any other product whose purpose is primarily functional and not ornamental.
15	(b) "ASTM F 2923-11" means the ASTM (American Society for Testing and Materials)
16	International Standard Specification for Consumer Product Safety for Children's Jewelry in effect
17	on January 1, 2012.
18	23-24.11-3. Requirements All children's jewelry manufactured one hundred eighty

- 1 (180) days after the effective date of this act shall meet the requirements of ASTM F 2923-11.
- 2 <u>23-24.11-4. Duration.</u> The provisions of this chapter shall remain in effect until a
- 3 <u>superseding federal standard for children's jewelry takes effect.</u>
- 4 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage.
