# RELATING TO ANIMALS AND ANIMAL HUSBANDRY - LIVESTOCK - WELFARE OF LIVESTOCK

It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

| 1  | SECTION 1. Title 4 of the General Laws entitled "ANIMALS AND ANIMAL                   |
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| 2  | HUSBANDRY" is hereby amended by adding thereto the following chapter:                 |

| 4  | THE RHODE ISLAND LIVESTOCK WELFARE AND CARE STANDARDS ADVISORY                        |
| 5  | COUNCIL ACT OF 2012   |
| 6  | 4-26-1. Short title This chapter shall be known and may be cited as the "Rhode Island |
| 7  | Livestock Welfare and Care Standards Advisory Council Act of 2012."                   |
| 8  | <u>4-26-2. Findings.</u> – <u>The general assembly hereby finds that:</u>             |
| 9  | (1) Livestock is the core of dairy and livestock farming in Rhode Island.             |
| 10 | (2) The care and management of livestock are important to the profitability of Rhode  |
| 11 | Island farms and the maintenance of Rhode Island's working landscape.                 |
| 12 | (3) There exists in this state a demand for safe, locally produced food.              |
| 13 | (4) Livestock raised on Rhode Island farms offers profit potential and economic       |
| 14 | opportunity for Rhode Island producers.   |
| 15 | (5) Livestock deserve a safe, healthy and humane environment that ensures protection  |
| 16 | from unnecessary or unjustifiable pain.   |
| 17 | (6) The state would benefit from a diverse body charged with making policy            |

recommendations to the department regarding livestock care.

|                  | <u>4-26-4. Advisory council established.</u> (a) There is established a livestock care          |
| standard         | ds advisory council consisting of the state veterinarian, or his or her designee, who shall     |
| serve as         | the chairperson and six (6) public members appointed by the director as follows:                |
|                  | (1) A representative from the Rhode Island farm bureau, or his or her designee, who shall       |
| serve as         | secretary;  |
|                  | (2) A representative from the Rhode Island society for the prevention of cruelty to             |
| animals.         | , or his or her designee;   |
|                  | (3) A Rhode island based livestock farmer, or his or her designee;                              |
|                  | (4) A representative from the University of Rhode Island department of environment and          |

| 1  | (b) Two (2) of those new memoers first appointed by the director shall serve initial terms         |
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| 2  | of three (3) years; two (2) of those new members first appointed by the director shall serve an    |
| 3  | initial term of two (2) years; and two (2) of those new members, appointed by the director shall   |
| 4  | serve an initial term of one year. Thereafter, all appointed members of the advisory council shall |
| 5  | be appointed to serve for terms of three (3) years. The members are eligible to succeed            |
| 6  | themselves. A vacancy other than by expiration shall be filled in the manner of the original       |
| 7  | appointment but only for the unexpired portion of the term.  |
| 8  | (c) The director may remove any member from the council for neglect of any duty                    |
| 9  | required by law, or for incompetence, or unprofessional or dishonorable conduct.                   |
| 10 | (d) The members of the council shall receive no compensation for their services but may            |
| 11 | receive reimbursement for travel and other necessary expenses while engaged in the performance     |
| 12 | of official duties of the council.   |
| 13 | (e) The council shall meet at least quarterly and at the call of the chairperson or four (4)       |
| 14 | members of the council. A majority of seats filled shall constitute a quorum.                      |
| 15 | (f) The council shall receive staff and administrative support from the department. The            |
| 16 | director shall furnish the advisory board a suitable location to hold its meeting.                 |
| 17 | (g) All departments and agencies of the state shall furnish such advice and information,           |
| 18 | documentation, and otherwise to the council and its agents as is deemed necessary or desirable by  |
| 19 | the council to facilitate the purposes of this chapter.  |
| 20 | 4-26-5. Duties of the council. – The council shall support and work collaboratively with           |
| 21 | the department as follows:   |
| 22 | (1) Review and evaluate laws and rules of the state applicable to the care and handling of         |
| 23 | livestock as defined in subsection 4-26-3(c') including, but not limited to:                       |
| 24 | (i) The overall health and welfare of livestock species;   |
| 25 | (ii) Agricultural operation best management practices;   |
| 26 | (iii) Biosecurity and disease prevention;  |
| 27 | (iv) Humane transport and slaughter practices; and   |
| 28 | (v) Any other matters the council considers necessary for the proper care and well being           |
| 29 | of livestock animals in the state.   |
| 30 | (2) Respond to requests from the legislature for information and comments on proposed              |
| 31 | legislation;   |
| 32 | (3) Issue recommendations necessary to achieve these goals;  |
| 33 | (4) Submit policy recommendations to the director and general assembly on any of the               |
| 34 | subject matter set forth under subdivision (ii) of this subsection.                                |

| 1 | 4-26-6. Reporting requirements (a) The council shall provide a report of its                   |
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| 2 | recommendations and findings. Said report shall be provided to the department, governor and    |
| 3 | general assembly by April 30, 2013.  |
| 4 | (b) Thereafter, the council shall provide a written report to the governor and the general     |
| 5 | assembly, no later than April 30 of each year, on the progress made in achieving the goals and |
| 6 | objectives set forth in this chapter and any other pertinent information by April 30, 2013.    |
| 7 | (c) The council shall be subject to the provisions of chapter 38-2, access to public records   |
| 8 | act, and chapter 42-46, open meetings act.   |
| 9 | SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage.  |
