It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 23-17 of the General Laws entitled "Licensing of Health Care 2 Facilities" is hereby amended by adding thereto the following section: 3 23-17-49.1. Required use of a brain monitor or pulse oximeter with general 4 anesthesia. - Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary contained in any general or 5 public law, rule or regulation, during any medical procedure where a patient will be rendered unconscious as a result of the use of general anesthesia, a brain monitor or a pulse oximeter, 6 7 whereby the oxygenation of a patient is monitored, must also be used. 8 SECTION 2. Chapter 27-18 of the General Laws entitled "Accident and Sickness 9 Insurance Policies" is hereby amended by adding thereto the following section: 10 27-18-71. Coverage for use of a brain monitor or pulse oximeter with general 11 anesthesia. - All expenses associated with the use of a brain monitor or a pulse oximeter are 12 eligible for reimbursement, where the use of general anesthesia is eligible for reimbursement, 13 under the provisions of any individual or group health insurance contract, plan or policy entered 14 into or renewed in this state on or after January 1, 2013. 15 SECTION 3. Chapter 27-19 of the General Laws entitled "Nonprofit Hospital Service Corporations" is hereby amended by adding thereto the following section: 16

27-19-62. Coverage for use of a brain monitor or pulse oximeter with general anesthesia. – All expenses associated with the use of a brain monitor or a pulse oximeter are eligible for reimbursement, where the use of general anesthesia is eligible for reimbursement,

2	into or renewed in this state on or after January 1, 2013.
3	SECTION 4. Chapter 27-20 of the General Laws entitled "Nonprofit Medical Service
4	Corporations" is hereby amended by adding thereto the following section:
5	27-20-57. Coverage for use of a brain monitor or pulse oximeter with general
6	anesthesia All expenses associated with the use of a brain monitor or a pulse oximeter are
7	eligible for reimbursement, where the use of general anesthesia is eligible for reimbursement,
8	under the provisions of any individual or group health insurance contract, plan or policy entered
9	into or renewed in this state on or after January 1, 2013.
10	SECTION 5. Chapter 27-20.1 of the General Laws entitled "Nonprofit Dental Service
11	Corporations" is hereby amended by adding thereto the following section:
12	27-20.1-21. Coverage for use of a brain monitor or pulse oximeter with general
13	anesthesia All expenses associated with the use of a brain monitor or a pulse oximeter are
14	eligible for reimbursement, where the use of general anesthesia is eligible for reimbursement,
15	under the provisions of any individual or group health insurance contract, plan or policy entered
16	into or renewed in this state on or after January 1, 2013.
17	SECTION 6. Chapter 27-41 of the General Laws entitled "Health Maintenance
18	Organizations" is hereby amended by adding thereto the following section:
19	27-41-75. Coverage for use of a brain monitor or pulse oximeter with general
20	anesthesia All expenses associated with the use of a brain monitor or a pulse oximeter are
21	eligible for reimbursement, where the use of general anesthesia is eligible for reimbursement,
22	under the provisions of any individual or group health insurance contract, plan or policy entered
23	into or renewed in this state on or after January 1, 2013.
24	SECTION 7. This act shall take effect upon passage.
