## AN ACT

## RELATING TO STATE AFFAIRS AND GOVERNMENT -- ENERGY EFFICIENCY

It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

- 1 SECTION 1. Sections 42-140.1-2, 42-140.1-3, 42-140.1-4 and 42-140.1-5 of the General 2 Laws in Chapter 42-140.1 entitled "The Rhode Island Energy Efficiency and Resource 3 Management Council" are hereby amended to read as follows: 4 42-140.1-2. Legislative findings. -- It is hereby found and declared: 5 (a) Rhode Island has experienced an energy cost crisis during 2005, and 2006 and 2008 and faces the prospect of fluctuating and increasing energy prices in the future. 6 7 (b) Energy conservation and energy efficiency have enormous, untapped potential for controlling energy costs and mitigating the effects of energy crisis for Rhode Island residents and 8 9 the Rhode Island economy. 10 (c) Rhode Island has lacked an integrated, comprehensive, public, stakeholder-driven 11 organizational structure to secure for Rhode Island and its people the full benefits of energy 12 efficiency, energy conservation, and energy resources management. 13 (d) Energy efficiency programs can create employment opportunities in Rhode Island. 14 42-140.1-3. Establishment of council -- Purposes. -- (a) There is hereby authorized, created and established a council to be known as "The Rhode Island Energy Efficiency and 15 Resources Management Council" with the powers and duties set forth in this chapter. 16
- 17 (b) The purposes of this council are to:
- 18 (1) Evaluate and make recommendations, including, but not limited to, plans and 19 programs, with regard to the optimization of energy efficiency, energy conservation, energy

resource development; and the development of a plan for least-cost procurement for Rhode Island; and

- 3 (2) Provide consistent, comprehensive, informed and publicly accountable stake-holder 4 involvement in energy efficiency, energy conservation, and energy resource management; and
  - (3) Monitor and evaluate the effectiveness of programs to achieve energy efficiency, energy conservation, and diversification of energy resources; and
  - (4) Promote public understanding of energy issues and of ways in which energy efficiency, energy conservation, and energy resource diversification and management can be effectuated; and
  - (5) Promote training and education programs that build a workforce capable of implementing the programs.
  - 42-140.1-4. Composition and appointment. -- (a) The council shall consist of eleven (11) fourteen (14) members appointed by the governor with the advice and consent of the senate; seven (7) nine (9) members shall be voting numbers, and the governor shall give due consideration to appointing persons with knowledge of: (1) energy regulation and law; (2) large commercial/industrial users, (3) small commercial/industrial users; (4) residential users; (5) low income users; (6) environmental issues pertaining to energy; (7) energy design and codes; and (8) energy efficiency education and job training; and (9) municipal energy users four (4) five (5) members shall be ex-officio, non-voting members, representing an electric distribution entity, a gas distribution entity, fuel oil or heating fuel industry, the director of labor and training or his/her designee from the department, and the commissioner of the office of energy resources. From the seven (7) nine (9) voting members, the governor shall appoint one person to be chairperson of the council and one person to be vice chairperson of the council; the commissioner of the office of energy resources shall be the executive secretary and executive director of the council.
  - (b) With the exception of the <u>director of labor and training or his/her designee and the</u> commissioner of the office of energy resources; of the initial appointments; three (3) members shall be appointed for a term of three (3) years, three (3) members shall be appointed for a term of four (4) years, and four (4) members shall be appointed for a term of five (5) years; thereafter members of the council shall be appointed for a term of five (5) years and may be reappointed.
  - (c) A simple majority of the total number of voting members shall constitute a quorum.
  - (d) A vacancy other than by expiration shall be filled in the manner of the original appointment but only for the unexpired portion of the term. The appointing authority shall have the power to remove its appointee for just cause.
  - (e) The members of the council shall not be compensated for their service but shall be

reimbursed for their actual expenses necessarily incurred in the performance of their duties. The provisions of this subdivision shall not apply to the executive secretary/executive director.

## 42-140.1-5. Powers and duties. -- The council shall have the power to:

- (a) Develop and recommend for implementation plans, programs and standards for energy conservation, energy efficiency, and diversification of energy resources.
- (b) Monitor and evaluate plans and programs for energy conservation, energy efficiency and diversification of energy resources; in order to effectuate such evaluations the council may request audits, including performance audits, of any program for energy conservation, energy efficiency or diversification of energy resources, that is established pursuant to Rhode Island law or is administered by a state agency, a request for an audit of any program operative pursuant to an order or decision of the public utilities commission shall be made to the commission; the council may make findings and recommendations with regard to changes, modification or continuation of any programs which it has authority to monitor or evaluate.
- (c) Submit to the joint committee on energy an annual report on/or before April 15 of each year, commencing in 2008, regarding the activities of the council; its assessment of energy issues; the status of system reliability; energy efficiency and conservation procurement; the number of Rhode Island energy efficiency businesses and vendors participating in the programs, including work related to energy audits, insulations, and equipment installations for the residential, small business, and large commercial and industrial sectors; the funding allocation that went into each of the eligible energy efficiency programs; and its recommendations regarding any improvements which might be necessary or desirable.
- (d) Participate in proceedings of the public utilities commission that pertain to the purposes of the council, including but not limited to proceedings regarding least-cost procurement as provided for in section 39-1-27.7.
- (e) Advise electric distribution companies with regard to implementation of least cost procurement.
- (f) Hold public meetings at least twice each year with the Rhode Island renewable energy coordinating board and/or the advisory council to coordinate efforts around the system reliability procurements plans, diversification of energy resources, and foster distributed generation of electricity.
- (f)(g) Advise the commission commissioner of energy resources, and recommend policies, standards, strategies, plans, programs, and procedures with regard to functions of the office of energy resources including but not limited to plans, strategies, and programs to:
  - (1) implement cost-effective energy conservation and energy efficiency programs;

1	(2) promote the development of eligible renewable energy resources for Rhode Island;
2	(3) foster distributed generation of electricity and demand response;
3	(4) assist low-income households in meeting energy needs;
4	(5) coordinate the use of funds, resources, and programs from diverse resources to
5	achieve the purposes of the office-; and
6	(6) Promote energy efficiency and conservation employment training and placement in
7	Rhode Island.
8	(g)(h) Consider such other matters as it may deem appropriate to the fulfillment of its
9	purposes, and may advise the governor, the general assembly, other parties, and the public with
10	regard to matters pertaining to its purposes and duties, which advice may include findings and
11	recommendations.
12	SECTION 2. Sections 42-140.3-5, 42-140.3-6, 42-140.3-7 and 42-140.3-10 of the
13	General Laws in Chapter 42-140.3 entitled "The Rhode Island Renewable Energy Coordinating
14	Board" are hereby amended to read as follows:
15	42-140.3-5. Composition of the board (a) The board shall have five (5) six (6)
16	members: - (1) The director of the department of administration, who shall serve as chairperson
17	of the board; (2) The commissioner of the office of energy resources; (3) The executive director
18	of the economic development corporation; (4) The director of the department of environmental
19	management; and (5) The director of the coastal resources management council; and the director
20	of labor and training. Any member of the board may appoint a designee from his or her respective
21	agency to represent him/her on the board.
22	(b) Three (3) members shall constitute a quorum A majority vote of the board shall be
23	required for all recommendations, advice, and approvals of the board in accordance with this
24	chapter.
25	42-140.3-6. Duties of the board The board shall:
26	(1) Develop and maintain the strategic plan in accordance with section 42-140.3-8.
27	(2) Issue the strategic plan biannual report in accordance with subsection 42-140.3-8(e).
28	(3) Issue recommendations as necessary to state agencies and cities and towns.
29	(4) Issue recommendations for improvements to existing renewable energy procurement
30	policies and programs that will create employment opportunities in Rhode Island.
31	(4)(5) Advise the governor and general assembly with regard to renewable energy
32	development in Rhode Island.
33	(5)(6) Provide a forum for discussion of issues relating to renewable energy development
34	in Rhode Island and receive testimony from the public and interest groups.

1	(6)(7) Make available to the public all information about activities of the board.
2	42-140.3-7. Powers of the board To effectuate its duties, the board shall have the
3	power to:
4	(1) Adopt and amend bylaws.
5	(2) Receive staff and administrative support from the department of administration.
6	(3) Hold public meetings at least quarterly and at the call of the chairperson or three (3)
7	board members, in order to: (i) Develop and maintain the strategic renewable energy plan; (ii)
8	Develop reports and issue recommendations; (iii) Receive testimony from the public and other
9	interested parties.
10	(4) Hold public meetings at least twice each year with the Rhode Island energy
11	efficiency and resources management council to coordinate efforts around the system reliability
12	procurement plans, diversification of energy resources, and foster distributed generation of
13	electricity.
14	(5) Engage any consultants or expert witnesses that it deems necessary to implement its
15	statutory responsibilities; provided, however, that to the maximum extent possible, the board shall
16	utilize staff from state agencies.
17	(6) Promote renewable energy employment training and placement in Rhode Island.
18	(6)(7) Establish and maintain a website with information on all activities of the board.
19	(7)(8) Comment on legislation pending before the general assembly.
20	42-140.3-10. Advisory council (a) The Rhode Island renewable energy coordinating
21	board advisory council is hereby established to advise the board on matters pertaining to the
22	board's duties and powers.
23	(b) The advisory council shall have (15) sixteen (16) members. With the exception of the
24	office of energy resources, each Each board member shall select three (3) advisory council
25	members, provided that the advisory council includes members with experience in the following
26	areas: (1) Renewable energy development; (2) Energy regulation and law; (3) Environmental
27	issues pertaining to renewable energy; (4) Business association or chamber of commerce; (5)
28	Green trades; (6) Residential energy consumers; (7) Low-income energy consumers; (8) Small
29	business relating to renewable energy; and (9) Commercial/industrial energy consumers; and (10)
30	Municipal energy users. If an advisory council member resigns from his or her position, the board
31	member responsible for the selection of that advisory council member shall select his or her
32	replacement in accordance with the experience requirements stipulated in this section.
33	(c) The advisory council shall hold at least six (6) public meetings a year.
