EXPRESSING OUR DEEPEST CONDOLENCES ON THE PASSING OF THE HONORABLE RICHARD H. "POP" JOHNSON

1 WHEREAS, It is with great sadness that this House has learned of the passing of The 2 Honorable Richard H. "Pop" Johnson, a man whose life and achievements will live on for many 3 years to come in the memories of everyone fortunate enough to have been touched by the quality 4 of this remarkable gentleman; and WHEREAS, Richard was the son of the late Henry E. and Catherine (Lynch) Johnson. 5 6 He was the devoted husband of Jean L. (Auckerman) and leaves behind four daughters, Kathleen 7 V. Zabbo, Susan J. LeComte, and her husband, Richard, Mary C. Johnson, and Alice V. Johnson, 8 and one son, Philip H. Johnson, and his wife, Wendy, a brother, Robert J. Johnson, and sister, 9 Carol Iannuzzi. He was the proud grandfather to seven grandchildren and five great 10 grandchildren. He was the father of the late James V. Johnson and father-in-law of the late Dr. 11 August Zabbo; and

WHEREAS, "Pop" graduated from LaSalle Academy, Class of 1949, where he was All-State, All-New England National School Boy Champion in track and cross country and team captain. He was also a graduate of Providence College, Class of 1953, where he was a member of the track and cross country, team captain, class treasurer, and cross country honorable mention. He received his education degree from Rhode Island College; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Johnson served Rhode Island in many capacities. He was a member of the Rhode Island House of Representatives, where he represented District 34 for eight years, and as a councilman for the City of Warwick for a short time. Pop was President of the RI Track and Field Association, and was elected to the Track Coaches Hall of Fame and Warwick Veterans Memorial High School Coaches Hall of Fame. A communicant of St. Rita Church, he served as trustee and was a member of the Holy Name Society. Pop received the Jefferson Award, was director of the Warwick Summer Head Start Program, and founder and first president of JONAH, Inc; and

6 WHEREAS, Mr. Johnson, "Pop," was an educator at the Lockwood School for two years 7 and also at Warwick Veterans Memorial High School for 32 years, where he served as a track 8 coach before retiring in 1987; and

9 WHEREAS, Even though we are diminished by this loss and mourn the passing of 10 Richard, so must we celebrate the spirit, generosity, and courage with which he lived every day of 11 his life; now, therefore be it
