It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

1	SECTION 1. Section 42-140.3-6 of the General Laws in Chapter 42-140.3 entitled "The
2	Rhode Island Renewable Energy Coordinating Board" is hereby amended to read as follows:
3	42-140.3-6. Duties of the board The board shall:
4	(1) Develop and maintain the strategic plan in accordance with section 42-140.3-8.
5	(2) Issue the strategic plan biannual report in accordance with subsection 42-140.3-8(e).
6	(3) Issue recommendations as necessary to state agencies and cities and towns.
7	(4) Advise the governor and general assembly with regard to renewable energy
8	development in Rhode Island.
9	(5) Provide a forum for discussion of issues relating to renewable energy development in
10	Rhode Island and receive testimony from the public and interest groups.
11	(6) Provide a forum for discussion on ways to support sustainable community
12	development and the creation of green job opportunities, including opportunities for new entrants
13	into the state's workforce, the long-term unemployed and displaced workers, and recent college
14	graduates.
15	(6)(7) Make available to the public all information about activities of the board.
16	SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage.
