3	SECTION 1. Section 16-8-10.1 of the General Laws in Chapter 16-8 entitled "Federal
4	Aid" is hereby amended to read as follows:
5	16-8-10.1. Mandatory school breakfast programs (a) All public schools shall make
6	a breakfast program available to students attending the school. The breakfast meal shall meet any
7	rules and regulations that are adopted by the commissioner.
8	(b) The state of Rhode Island shall may provide school districts a per breakfast subsidy
9	for each breakfast served to students. The general assembly shall may choose to annually
10	appropriate some sum and distribute it based on each district's proportion of the number of
11	breakfasts served in the prior school year relative to the statewide total in the same year. This
12	subsidy, if appropriated, shall augment the nonprofit school food service account and be used for
13	expenses incurred in providing nutritious breakfast meals to students.
14	SECTION 2. Section 16-23-3.1 of the General Laws in Chapter 16-23 entitled
15	"Textbooks" is hereby repealed.
16	16-23-3.1. Reimbursements to municipalities for costs of English/language arts and
17	history/social studies textbooks for students in grades K-12 There is hereby established a
18	textbook reimbursement fund for which the general assembly shall make a specific appropriation.
19	The department of elementary and secondary education shall administer the appropriation. School
20	districts shall submit to the department of elementary and secondary education evidence of the
21	cost of English/language arts and/or history/social studies textbooks that the district has provided
22	to students in grades K-12 pursuant to § 16-23-2. The costs shall be reimbursed from the textbook
23	reimbursement fund by the department of elementary and secondary education upon presentation
24	by a school district of the evidence of cost.

25 SECTION 3. This article shall take effect as of July 1, 2014.
