Sapinsley, beloved wife for sixty-nine years to the late John M. 3 Sapinsley, and the devoted mother of four daughters, Patricia Sapinsley and her husband, Harold 4 Levy, Joan Sapinsley and her husband, Richard Lewis, Jill Mooney and her husband, James, and Carol Rubenstein and her husband, Alan. She was also the loving grandmother to nine beautiful 5 grandchildren and a well-respected former Rhode Island State Senator; and 6 7 WHEREAS, Ms. Sapinsley was a trail-blazer and champion for women's issues and open 8 government. While serving as a Rhode Island State Senator, she became the first female to hold a 9 leadership post after being chosen by her Republican peers to become the Senate Minority Leader; and 10 11 WHEREAS, In addition to her service to our state in the General Assembly, Ms. 12 Sapinsley was a mentor and trusted advisor to decades of Rhode Island's leaders as well as 13 generations of young women across the state. She served as the Public Utilities Commissioner, 14 Chairwoman of the Rhode Island Housing and Mortgage Finance Corporation, and was a 15 constitutional convention delegate; and WHEREAS, Throughout her lifetime, Ms. Sapinsley was an active and contributing 16 member of the community, working with countless community organizations including Trinity 17

Repertory Company, Butler Hospital, Providence Public Library, Rhode Island Board of Regents,

Dorcas' Place, American Civil Liberties Union, Planned Parenthood of Rhode Island, and
