# RELATING TO MOTOR AND OTHER VEHICLES -- DEFINITIONS AND GENERAL CODE PROVISIONS

It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 31-1-3 of the General Laws in Chapter 31-1 entitled "Definitions
 and General Code Provisions" is hereby amended to read as follows:

3 <u>**31-1-3. Types of vehicles. --**</u> (a) (1) "Antique motor car" means any motor vehicle that is 4 more than twenty-five (25) years old. Unless fully inspected and meeting inspection 5 requirements, the vehicle may be maintained solely for use in exhibitions, club activities, parades, 6 and other functions of public interest. The vehicle may also be used for limited enjoyment and 7 purposes other than the previously mentioned activities, but may not be used primarily for the 8 transportation of passengers or goods over any public highway.

9 (2) After the vehicle has met the requirements of state inspection, a registration plate 10 may be issued to it on payment of the standard fee. The vehicle may be operated on the highways 11 of this and other states, and may, in addition to the registration plate, retain the designation 12 "antique" and display an "antique plate".

13 (3)(i) For any vehicle that is more than twenty-five (25) years old, the division of motor 14 vehicles may shall also issue or approve, subject to rules and regulations that may be promulgated 15 by the administrator, a "year of manufacture plate" or a "year of manufacture plate" in the 16 possession of the applicant for the vehicle that is an exact replica plate designating the exact year 17 of manufacture of the vehicle. , and shall comply with the following provisions:

18 (ii) The vehicle owner must complete an application designed by the division of motor

- 1 vehicles and sign in the presence of a notary. 2 (iii) The plate must be physically presented to the administrator for inspection and approval in accordance with the following: 3 4 (A) The plate must be in good repair and in original condition. Its letters, numbers and 5 markings must be clearly legible. Any indication that the plate has been repainted or otherwise altered will cause the administrator to reject use of the plate. 6 7 (B) The plate must be sufficiently distinctive in appearance so as not to be confused with 8 currently issued plates. If the administrator has already approved the use of a plate as a "year of 9 manufacture" plate, which contains a specific combination of letters and numbers (or letters or 10 numbers alone), that same combination on a different "year of manufacture plate" is not 11 sufficiently distinctive and will not be approved as another "year of manufacture plate". 12 (C) A "year of manufacture plate" may be approved by the administrator for use on an 13 antique motor car of a different type than that for which the registration plate was originally 14 issued. For example, a truck plate may be approved for use on an antique automobile and an 15 automobile plate may be approved for use on an antique truck provided, a motorcycle plate shall 16 only be used on a motorcycle. 17 (D) The administrator may approve of the display of only one "year of manufacture plate", if that is all that is available, even though the division of motor vehicles issued two (2) 18 19 plates per vehicle in the year the plate was originally issued. 20 (E) A "year of manufacture plate" must be displayed pursuant to §31-3-18 but the 21 registration decal for the current registration period need not be attached to the plate. If it is not 22 attached to the plate it must be carried in the antique vehicle at all times and presented at the 23 request of a police officer. 24 (F) A plate displaying the word "antique" cannot be used as a "year of manufacture plate." 25 (iv) If the "year of manufacture plate" is ever suspended or revoked, the administrator 26 27 may require the plate be turned in to the division of motor vehicles. 28 (b) (1) "Antique motorcycle" means any motorcycle that is more than twenty-five (25) 29 years old. Unless fully inspected and meeting inspection requirements, the vehicle shall be 30 maintained solely for use in exhibitions, club activities, parades, and other functions of public 31 interest. The vehicle may also be used for limited enjoyment and purposes other than the
- 32 previously mentioned activities, but may not be used primarily for the transportation of 33 passengers or goods over any public highway; and
- 34

(2) After the vehicle has met the requirements of state inspection, a registration plate

1 may be issued to it, on payment of the standard fee, and the vehicle may be operated on the 2 highways of this and other states, and may, in addition to the registration plate, retain the 3 designation "antique" and display an "antique plate".

4 (c) "Authorized emergency vehicle" means vehicles of the fire department (fire patrol); 5 police vehicles; vehicles used by Rhode Island state marshals in the department of corrections; vehicles used by the state bomb squad within the division of state fire marshal; vehicles of 6 7 municipal departments or public service corporations designated or authorized by the 8 administrator as ambulances and emergency vehicles; and privately owned motor vehicles of 9 volunteer firefighters or privately owned motor vehicles of volunteer ambulance drivers or 10 attendants, as authorized by the department chief or commander and permitted by the Rhode 11 Island Association of Fire Chiefs and Rhode Island Association of Police Chiefs Joint Committee 12 for Volunteer Warning Light Permits.

(d) "Automobile" means, for registration purposes, every motor vehicle carrying
passengers other than for hire.

(e) "Bicycle" means every vehicle having two (2) tandem wheels, except scooters and
 similar devices, propelled exclusively by human power, and upon which a person may ride.

(f) "Camping recreational vehicle" means a vehicular type camping unit, certified by the
manufacturer as complying with ANSI A119.2 Standards, designed primarily as temporary living
quarters for recreation that has either its own motor power or is mounted on, or towed by, another
vehicle. The basic units are tent trailers, fifth-wheel trailers, motorized campers, travel trailers,
and pick-up campers.

(g) "Electric motorized bicycles" means a motorized bicycle that may be propelled by
human power or electric motor power, or by both, with an electric motor rated not more than two
(2) (S.A.E.) horsepower, that is capable of a maximum speed of not more than twenty-five (25)
miles per hour.

(h) "Electric personal assistive mobility device" ("EPAMD") is a self-balancing, nontandem two-wheeled (2) device, designed to transport only one person, with an electric
propulsion system that limits the maximum speed of the device to fifteen (15) miles per hour.

(i) Fifth-wheel trailer: A towable recreational vehicle, not exceeding four hundred (400)
square feet in area, designed to be towed by a motorized vehicle that contains a towing
mechanism that is mounted above or forward of the tow vehicle's rear axle and that is eligible to
be registered for highway use.

(j) "Hearse" means every motor vehicle used for transporting human corpses. A hearse
 shall be considered an automobile for registration purposes.

1 (k) "Jitney or bus" means: (1) A "public bus" that includes every motor vehicle, trailer, 2 semi-trailer, tractor trailer, or tractor trailer combination, used for the transportation of passengers 3 for hire, and operated wholly or in part upon any street or highway as a means of transportation 4 similar to that afforded by a street railway company, by indiscriminately receiving or discharging 5 passengers, or running on a regular route or over any portion of one, or between fixed termini; or (2) A "private bus" that includes every motor vehicle other than a public bus or passenger van 6 7 designed for carrying more than ten (10) passengers and used for the transportation of persons, 8 and every motor vehicle other than a taxicab designed and used for the transportation of persons 9 for compensation.

- (1) "Motorcycle" means only those motor vehicles having not more than three (3) wheels
  in contact with the ground and a saddle on which the driver sits astride, except bicycles with
  helper motors as defined in subsection (n) of this section.
- (m) "Motor-driven cycle" means every motorcycle, including every motor scooter, with
  a motor of no greater than five (5) horsepower, except bicycles with helper motors as defined in
  subsection (n) of this section.

(n) "Motorized bicycles" means two-wheel (2) vehicles that may be propelled by human
power or helper power, or by both, with a motor rated not more than four and nine-tenths (4.9)
horsepower and not greater than fifty (50) cubic centimeters, that are capable of a maximum
speed of not more than thirty (30) miles per hour.

(o) Motorized camper: A camping recreational vehicle, built on, or permanently attached
to, a self-propelled motor vehicle chassis cab or van that is an integral part of the completed
vehicle.

(p) "Motorized tricycles" means tricycles that may be propelled by human power or
helper motor, or by both, with a motor rated no more than 1.5 brake horsepower that is capable of
a maximum speed of not more than thirty (30) miles per hour.

26 (q) "Motorized wheelchair" means any self-propelled vehicle, designed for, and used by,
27 a person with a disability that is incapable of speed in excess of eight (8) miles per hour.

(r) "Motor scooter" means a motor-driven cycle with a motor rated not more than four
and nine-tenths (4.9) horsepower and not greater than fifty (50) cubic centimeters that is capable
of a maximum speed of not more than thirty (30) miles per hour.

(s) "Motor vehicle" means every vehicle that is self-propelled or propelled by electric
power obtained from overhead trolley wires, but not operated upon rails, except vehicles moved
exclusively by human power, an EPAMD and electric motorized bicycles as defined in subsection
(g) of this section, and motorized wheelchairs.

1 (t) "Motor vehicle for hire" means every motor vehicle other than jitneys, public buses, 2 hearses, and motor vehicles used chiefly in connection with the conduct of funerals, to transport 3 persons for compensation in any form, or motor vehicles rented for transporting persons either 4 with or without furnishing an operator.

5 (u) Park trailer: A camping recreational vehicle that is eligible to be registered for highway use and meets the following criteria: (1) Built on a single chassis mounted on wheels; 6 7 and (2) Certified by the manufacturer as complying with ANSI A119.5.

8 (v) "Passenger van" means every motor vehicle capable of carrying ten (10) to fourteen 9 (14) passengers plus an operator and used for personal use or on a not-for-hire basis. Passenger 10 vans may be used for vanpools, transporting passengers to and from work locations, provided that 11 the operator receives no remuneration other than free use of the vehicle.

12 (w) "Pedal carriages" (also known as "quadricycles") means a nonmotorized bicycle with 13 four (4) or more wheels operated by one or more persons for the purpose of, or capable of, 14 transporting additional passengers in seats or on a platform made a part of or otherwise attached 15 to the pedal carriage. The term shall not include a bicycle with trainer or beginner wheels affixed 16 to it, nor shall it include a wheelchair or other vehicle with the purpose of operation by or for the 17 transportation of a handicapped person, nor shall it include a tricycle built for a child or an adult 18 with a seat for only one operator and no passenger.

19 (x) "Pick-up camper": A camping recreational vehicle consisting of a roof, floor, and 20 sides designed to be loaded onto and unloaded from the back of a pick-up truck.

21 (y) "Rickshaws" (also known as "pedi cabs") means a nonmotorized bicycle with three 22 (3) wheels operated by one person for the purpose of, or capable of, transporting additional 23 passengers in seats or on a platform made a part of, or otherwise attached to, the rickshaw. This 24 definition shall not include a bicycle built for two (2) where the operators are seated one behind 25 the other, nor shall it include the operation of a bicycle with trainer or beginner wheels affixed 26 thereto, nor shall it include a wheelchair or other vehicle with the purpose of operation by or for 27 the transportation of a handicapped person.

28 (z) "School bus" means every motor vehicle owned by a public or governmental agency, 29 when operated for the transportation of children to or from school; or privately owned, when 30 operated for compensation for the transportation of children to or from school.

31 (aa) "Suburban vehicle" means every motor vehicle with a convertible or 32 interchangeable body or with removable seats, usable for both passenger and delivery purposes, 33 and including motor vehicles commonly known as station or depot wagons or any vehicle into 34 which access can be gained through the rear by means of a hatch or trunk and where the rear seats

1 can be folded down to permit the carrying of articles as well as passengers.

(bb) "Tent trailer": A towable recreational vehicle that is mounted on wheels and
constructed with collapsible partial side walls that fold for towing by another vehicle and unfold
for use and that is eligible to be registered for highway use.

5 (cc) "Trackless trolley coach" means every motor vehicle that is propelled by electric
6 power obtained from overhead trolley wires, but not operated on rails.

7 (dd) Travel trailer: A towable recreational vehicle, not exceeding three hundred twenty
8 (320) square feet in area, designed to be towed by a motorized vehicle containing a towing
9 mechanism that is mounted behind the tow vehicle's bumper and that is eligible to be registered
10 for highway use.

(ee) "Vehicle" means every device in, upon, or by which any person or property is or
may be transported or drawn upon a highway, except devices used exclusively upon stationary
rails or tracks.

14 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage.
