EXPRESSING DEEPEST SYMPATHY ON THE UNTIMELY PASSING OF JAMESTOWN POLICE OFFICER RYAN J. BOURQUE

1 WHEREAS, It is with great sadness that this House has learned of the tragic passing of 2 Jamestown Police Officer Ryan J. Bourque, the beloved son of Lee Ann and Gary Bourque, a 3 well-respected one-year veteran with the Jamestown Police Department, and a resident of the 4 Town of Coventry; and WHEREAS, Patrolman Bourque was a 2009 graduate of Bishop Hendricken High School 5 and had continued his education at the University of Rhode Island. He was a 2015 graduate of 6 7 the Rhode Island Municipal Police Academy and a fitness enthusiast who kept in shape lifting weights; and 8 9 WHEREAS, Patrolman Bourque was a valued member of the Jamestown Police 10 Department, a small force that employs 13 full-time officers. He was described as the kind of 11 young man you would want your sons to emulate, and as a humble, quiet and respectful guy, who 12 always had a smile on his face and was well-liked by all who knew him; and 13 WHEREAS, Patrolman Bourque had just finished up his 3-to-11 p.m. shift, completing 14 his first year on the job with the Jamestown Police Department, and was headed home on Route 15 95 south, when his car was struck by a motorist who had made an illegal U-turn, and was driving north, going the wrong way in the same lane as Patrolman Bourque. The collision that ensued 16 17 resulted in the death of both drivers; and

WHEREAS, Ryan Bourque had long aspired to be a police officer and to go about the

day-to-day task of upholding the laws of this state. He had wanted to connect with people and
