She also enjoyed playing the piano and accordion, particularly for the summer Conanicut Yacht Club Youth Group and for the residents of the Forest Farm Nursing Home; and

WHEREAS, In addition to her family life, Mrs. Richardson had been employed as an expert bookkeeper in Providence and later with New Visions in Newport. She subsequently retired as the Executive Director of the Jamestown Senior Center after twenty-two years of service; and 1 WHEREAS, Always very active in the community, Mrs. Richardson was the first 2 Republican woman elected to the Jamestown Town Council, where she served her constituency 3 for many years. She was also a member of the American Legion Ladies Auxiliary, the Business 4 and Professional Women's Association, Jamestown Chapter, and was a member and served on the 5 board of the Conanicut Grange and Pomona Grange, and was a member and served as secretary 6 of the Beavertail Lighthouse Museum Association; and
