It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 16-16-24 of the General Laws in Chapter 16-16 entitled "Teachers'

Retirement [See Title 16 Chapter 97 - The Rhode Island Board of Education Act]" is hereby

16-16-24. Substitute teaching and employment after retirement.

(a) Any teacher or athletic coach certified pursuant to chapter 11.1 of this title, who has retired under the provisions of any law of this state, may substitute as a teacher at state schools and in the public schools of this state for a period of no more than ninety (90) one hundred (100) days in any one school year without any forfeiture of, or reduction in, the retirement benefits and allowances the teacher is receiving, or may receive, as a retired teacher. Notice of the employment shall be sent monthly to the state retirement board by the school committee employing the teacher and by the employer and by the retired teacher at the end of each teaching assignment.

(b) Any teacher or athletic coach certified pursuant to chapter 11.1 of this title, who has retired under the provisions of any law of this state, may be employed to fill a vacant position (including, but not limited to, employment as a tutor, mentor principal, or mentor assistant principal) by any state school or public school of this state for a period of no more than ninety (90) one hundred (100) days in any one school year without any forfeiture of, or reduction in, the retirement benefits and allowances he or she is receiving, or may receive, as a retiree. Notice of the employment shall be sent monthly to the state retirement board by the employer and by the

- 2 section after July 1, 2002, unless the employer has made a good-faith effort each school year to
- 3 fill the position with a nonretired employee without success, and certifies, in writing, that it has
- 4 done so to the employees' retirement system and to the bargaining agents of all education unions
- 5 with whom the employer has collective-bargaining agreements.
- 6 (c) Any retired teacher or athletic coach may be employed pursuant to subsections (a) and
- 7 (b), but in no event shall employment exceed ninety (90) one hundred (100) days.
- 8 (d) The calculation of the ninety one hundred -day (90) one hundred (100) period in any
- 9 one school year shall be determined by either of the following methods:
- 10 (1) Three (3) hours shall constitute a half day and the number of half days shall be limited
- 11 to one hundred eighty (180) two hundred (200) half days, which shall be the equivalent of ninety
- 12 (90) one hundred (100) full days; or
- 13 (2) Each period per day shall constitute one-fifth (1/5) of a teaching day. Any teacher
- hired to teach two (2) periods per day shall be deemed to have worked seventy two (72) eighty
- 15 (80) full days per year. The computation is two-fifths times one hundred eighty (2/5 x 180) two
- hundred (2/5 x 200) school days per year, which shall be equivalent to seventy two (72) eighty
- 17 (80) full days per year.
- 18 (e) Any retired member of the employees retirement system of Rhode Island under title
- 19 36 or 45, who is certified as a substitute teacher, may substitute as a teacher at state schools and
- in the public schools of this state for a period of no more than ninety (90) one hundred (100) days
- 21 in any one school year without any forfeiture of, or reduction in, the retirement benefits and
- 22 allowances the substitute teacher is receiving, or may receive, as a retiree under any title. The
- other provisions of subsections (b) through (d) shall also be deemed to apply.
- 24 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage.

EXPLANATION

BY THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL

This act would increase the number of days a retired teacher may substitute teach or be otherwise employed by a school system from ninety (90) days to one hundred (100) days without a reduction or forfeiture of retirement benefits.
