1 RESOLVED, That there is hereby appropriated, out of any money in the treasury not 2 otherwise appropriated for the fiscal year 2017-2018, the sum of three hundred thousand dollars 3 (\$300,000) to the Department of Health's Health Equity Zone project to support offering children in grade 5 through 8 new or enhanced extended learning opportunities during afterschool and out-4 5 of-school time; and the state controller is hereby authorized and directed to draw his orders upon the general treasurer for the payment of said sum, or so much thereof as may be from time 6 required, upon receipt of properly authenticated vouchers. Activities eligible for support may 7 include, but not be limited to, art and design, music, theatre, sports and recreational or educational 8 9 assistance. Additional eligible activities may include addressing issues that challenge student participation in said activities, including access to space and transportation. Municipalities, school 10 11 districts and not-for-profit organizations are eligible to apply. Funding may be used as matching 12 to pursue additional program support from other grants and charitable donations.
