RELATING TO HEALTH AND SAFETY -- RESTROOM ACCESS ACT

It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

1	SECTION 1. Title 23 of the General Laws entitled "HEALTH AND SAFETY" is hereby
2	amended by adding thereto the following chapter:
3	<u>CHAPTER 20.13</u>

- 4RESTROOM ACCESS ACT523-20.13-1. Short title.6This act shall be known and may be cited as the "Restroom Access Act."723-20.13-2. Definitions.8As used in this section:
- 9 (1) "Customer" means an individual who is lawfully on the premises of a retail
 10 establishment.
- 11 (2) "Eligible medical condition" means Crohn's disease, ulcerative colitis, any other
- 12 inflammatory bowel disease, irritable bowel syndrome, pregnancy, cancer or any other medical
- 13 condition that requires immediate access to a restroom facility.
- 14 (3) "Retail establishment" means a place of business open to the general public for the sale
- 15 of goods or services.

16 <u>23-20.13-3. Customer access to retail establishment restroom facilities.</u>

- 17 <u>A retail establishment that has a restroom facility for its employees shall allow a customer</u>
- 18 to use that facility during normal business hours if all of the following conditions are met:
- 19 (1) The customer requesting the use of the employee restroom facility suffers from an

- 1 <u>eligible medical condition or utilizes an ostomy device;</u>
- 2 (2) Three (3) or more employees of the retail establishment are working at the time the
- 3 customer requests use of the employee restroom facility;
- 4 (3) The retail establishment does not normally make a restroom available to the public;
- 5 (4) The employee restroom facility is not located in an area where providing access would
- 6 create an obvious health or safety risk to the customer or an obvious security risk to the retail
- 7 <u>establishment;</u>
- 8 (5) A public restroom is not immediately accessible to the customer; and
- 9 (6) When requesting access to an employee restroom facility, a customer shall present to
- 10 <u>an employee of the retail establishment proof of an eligible medical condition. The proof shall take</u>
- 11 the form of a document issued by a licensed physician or the Crohn's & Colitis Foundation of
- 12 <u>America identifying the presenter of the document and citing the appropriate statutory authority.</u>
- 13 **<u>23-20.13-4. Liability.</u>**
- 14 (a) A retail establishment or an employee of a retail establishment shall not be civilly liable
- 15 for any act or omission in allowing a customer, who claims to have an eligible medical condition,
- 16 to use an employee restroom facility that is not a public restroom if the act or omission meets all of
- 17 <u>the following:</u>
- 18 (1) It is not willful or grossly negligent;
- 19 (2) It occurs in an area of the retail establishment that is not accessible to the public; and
- 20 (3) It results in an injury to or death of the customer or any individual other than an
- 21 <u>employee accompanying the customer.</u>
- 22 (b) A retail establishment is not required to make any physical changes or improvements
- 23 to an employee restroom facility located on the premises pursuant to this section.
- 24 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect on January 1, 2022.

EXPLANATION

BY THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL

OF

AN ACT

RELATING TO HEALTH AND SAFETY -- RESTROOM ACCESS ACT

1 This act would require retail establishments with three (3) or more employees on the 2 premises without immediately accessible public restroom facilities to allow customers suffering 3 from eligible medical conditions access to their employee restrooms upon presentation of 4 documentation issued by a licensed physician. 5 This act would take effect on January 1, 2022.
