It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 16-98-4 of the General Laws in Chapter 16-98 entitled "Access to
- 2 Advanced Placement Courses for All Students Act [See Title 16 Chapter 97 - The Rhode Island
- 3 Board of Education Act]" is hereby amended to read as follows:

16-98-4. Powers and duties of department.

- 5 (a) Guidelines. The department shall promulgate rules, regulations and procedures 6 necessary for the implementation of this chapter including, but not limited to, the following:
 - (1) In consultation with the college board, certify those teacher-training entities that are qualified to provide training of teachers to teach advanced placement courses in the four (4) core academic areas;
 - (2) In certifying teacher-training entities for this program, the department shall ensure that the training times and locations will be geographically accessible for teachers from eligible school entities to attend;
 - (3) The department, in consultation with the college board, shall ensure that training provided by those teacher-training entities must provide teachers of advanced placement courses with the necessary content knowledge and instructional skills to prepare students for success in advanced placement courses and examinations; and
- (4) Establish a process for the Community College of Rhode Island, Rhode Island College 17 18 and the University of Rhode Island to accept for college credit an advanced placement subject test

2	(5) Starting at the end of the first year of the program, and every year thereafter, the
3	department shall issue a report to the general assembly on the advanced placement teacher-training
4	program that shall include, but not be limited to:
5	(i) The number of teachers receiving training in advanced placement instructions in school
6	entities, school districts and high schools in each of the four (4) core academic areas.
7	(ii) The number of students taking advanced placement courses at school entities in each
8	of the four (4) core academic areas.
9	(iii) The number of students scoring a three (3) or more on an advanced placement
10	examination at school entities in each of the four (4) core academic areas.
11	(iv) The remaining unmet need for trained teachers in school entities that do not offer
12	advanced placement courses.
13	(v) The number of individuals applying advanced placement test scores towards college
14	credit at the Community College of Rhode Island, Rhode Island College and the University of
15	Rhode Island.
16	(vi) The number of college credits issued by the Community College of Rhode Island,
17	Rhode Island College and the University of Rhode Island due to students' advanced placement
18	subject test score of three (3) ("qualified") or better in an advanced placement course provided
19	<u>herein.</u>
20	(b) Exemptions. The University of Rhode Island's College of Engineering shall be exempt
21	from the provisions of subsections (a)(4) and (a)(5)(vi) of this section.
22	SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage.
