It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

SECTION 1. Sections 16-107-3, 16-107-4 and 16-107-6 of the General Laws in Chapter

16-107 entitled "Rhode Island Promise Scholarship" are hereby amended to read as follows:

16-107-3. Establishment of scholarship program.

Beginning with the high school graduating class of 2017, it there is hereby established the
Rhode Island promise scholarship program that will end with the high school graduating class of
2021. The general assembly shall annually appropriate the funds necessary to implement the
purposes of this chapter. Additional funds beyond the scholarships may be appropriated to support
and advance the Rhode Island promise scholarship program. In addition to appropriation by the
general assembly, charitable donations may be accepted into the scholarship program.

- When used in this chapter, the following terms shall have the following meanings:
- 12 (1) "FAFSA" means the Free Application for Federal Student Aid form;
 - (2) "Mandatory fees and tuition" are the costs that every student is required to pay in order to enroll in classes, and does not include room and board, textbooks, program fees that may exist in some majors, course fees that may exist for some specific courses, meal plans, or travel;
 - (3) "On track to graduate on time" means the standards determined by the community college of Rhode Island in establishing the expectation of a student to graduate with an associate's degree within two (2) years of enrollment (recognizing that some students, including students who require developmental education, are double majors, or are enrolled in certain professional

1	programs may require an extended time period for degree completion);
2	(4) "Scholarship program" means the Rhode Island promise scholarship program that is
3	established pursuant to § 16-107-3;
4	(5) "Recipient student" means a student attending the community college of Rhode Island
5	who qualifies to receive the Rhode Island promise scholarship pursuant to § 16-107-6; and
6	(6) "State" means the state of Rhode Island and Providence Plantations.;
7	(7) "Student with a disability" means any student otherwise eligible pursuant to § 16-107-
8	6 who has a physical, developmental or hidden disability or disabilities, as defined in § 42-87-1.
9	that would create a hardship or other functional obstacles preventing participation in this program:
.0	(8) "ADA" means the American with Disabilities Act 42 U.S.C. § 12101, as may be
1	amended from time to time; and
2	(9) "Reasonable accommodations" means any necessary modifications or adjustment to a
.3	facility, equipment, program or manner of operation as required by the Americans with Disabilities
4	Act ("ADA") and section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 as may be amended from time to
.5	time.
6	16-107-6. Eligibility for scholarship.
7	(a) Beginning with the students who enroll at the community college of Rhode Island in
.8	the fall of 2017 and ending with students who enroll at the community college of Rhode Island in
9	the fall of 2021, to be considered for the scholarship, a student:
20	(1) Must qualify for in-state tuition and fees pursuant to the residency policy adopted by
21	the council on postsecondary education, as amended, supplemented, restated, or otherwise modified
22	from time to time ("residency policy"); provided, that, the student must have satisfied the high
23	school graduation/equivalency diploma condition prior to reaching nineteen (19) years of ages
24	provided, further, that in addition to the option of meeting the requirement by receiving a high
25	school equivalency diploma as described in the residency policy, the student can satisfy the
26	condition by receiving other certificates or documents of equivalent nature from the state or its
27	municipalities as recognized by applicable regulations promulgated by the council on elementary
28	and secondary education;
29	(2) Must be admitted to, and must enroll and attend the community college of Rhode Island
80	on a full-time basis by the semester immediately following high school graduation or the semester
81	immediately following receipt of a high school equivalency diploma;
32	(3) Must complete the FAFSA and any required FAFSA verification by the deadline
3	prescribed by the community college of Rhode Island for each year in which the student seeks to
34	receive funding under the scholarship program;

1	(4) Must continue to be enrolled on a full-time basis;
2	(5) Must maintain an average annual cumulative grade point average (GPA) of 2.5 or
3	greater, as determined by the community college of Rhode Island;
4	(6) Must remain on track to graduate on time as determined by the community college of
5	Rhode Island;
6	(7) Must not have already received an award under this scholarship program; and
7	(8) Must commit to live, work, or continue their education in Rhode Island after graduation.
8	The community college of Rhode Island shall develop a policy that will secure this
9	commitment from recipient students.
10	(b) Notwithstanding the eligibility requirements under subsection (a) of this section
11	("specified conditions"):
12	(i) In the case of a recipient student who has an approved medical or personal leave of
13	absence or is unable to satisfy one or more specified conditions because of the student's medical or
14	personal circumstances, the student may continue to receive an award under the scholarship
15	program upon resuming the student's education so long as the student continues to meet all other
16	applicable eligibility requirements; and
17	(ii) In the case of a recipient student who is a member of the national guard or a member
18	of a reserve unit of a branch of the United States military and is unable to satisfy one or more
19	specified conditions because the student is or will be in basic or special military training, or is or
20	will be participating in a deployment of the student's guard or reserve unit, the student may continue
21	to receive an award under the scholarship program upon completion of the student's basic or special
22	military training or deployment-; and
23	(iii) Any student with a disability, otherwise eligible for a scholarship pursuant to the
24	provisions of this section, as of May 15, 2021, shall be entitled to access this program and shall be
25	afforded all reasonable accommodations, as required by the ADA and the Rehabilitation Act of
26	1973, including, but not limited to, enrolling on a part-time basis, attaining a high school
27	diploma/GED by age twenty-one (21), and taking longer than two (2) years to graduate with an
28	associate's degree.
