Irons, former President of the 3 Rhode Island Senate, and the devoted mother of three daughters, Joan Cronin and her husband 4 Pat, Sarah Irons, and Katherine Sudol and her husband, Brad; and 5 WHEREAS, Born in Hampton, Virginia, Mrs. Irons was a daughter of the late Camille and Katherine Durand, and the sister of Barbara Traverse and her husband, Stan, COL (Retired), 6 7 Michael Durand, Joe Durand and his wife, Beth, and sister-in-law of Evelyn Bain. They had both been employed in the insurance 12 industry for many years, where she had served as the Executive Director of the Rhode Island Life 13 Underwriters Association: and 14 WHEREAS, In addition, Mrs. Irons was deeply committed to serving her community and 15 for forty-four years had worked with and developed everlasting friendships within the General 16 Federation of Women's Clubs, initially as one of the founding members of the Wampanoag Women's Club in Rumford, and later holding myriad leadership positions in the General 17 18 Federation of Women's Clubs Rhode Island, including serving as State President, and on 19 numerous General Federation of Women's Clubs International committees. She had also worked

with State Senate and Rhode Island National Education Association staff members to lead the

Gingerbread Express program, an altruistic endeavor that donates gifts to children in need; and
WHEREAS, With her generous and loving personality, Mary Irons created and nurtured
a marriage that flourished and a home that was warm and welcoming. She doted on her family
and was especially proud to be "Grand Mary" to her grandchildren, Caroline Mary, Meredith,
