RELATING TO HUMAN SERVICES -- MEDICAL ASSISTANCE

It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

- 1 SECTION 1. Chapter 40-8 of the General Laws entitled "Medical Assistance" is hereby
- 2 amended by adding thereto the following section:
 - 40-8-3.2. Eligibility for Medicare savings programs.
- 4 (a) Beginning July 1, 2022, and annually thereafter, the secretary of the executive office of
- 5 <u>health and human services shall increase income disregards used to determine eligibility by the</u>
- 6 department of human services for the federal Medicare Savings Programs administered in
- 7 accordance with the provisions of 42 U.S.C. 1396d(p) as follows:
- 8 (1) For the Qualified Medicare Beneficiary Program by an amount that equalizes the
- 9 income level at or below one hundred eighty-five percent (185%) of the federal poverty level;

10 (2) For the Specified Low Income Medicare Beneficiary Program by an amount that

11 equalizes the income level at or below two hundred percent (200%) of the federal poverty level;

12 <u>and</u>

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- 13 (3) For the Qualifying Individual Program by an amount that equalizes the income level at
- 14 or below two-hundred and twenty-five percent (225%) of the federal poverty level.
- 15 (b) The secretary shall not apply an asset test for eligibility under the Medicare savings

16 programs.

- 17 (c) The secretary shall submit any Medicaid state plan amendment or waiver necessary to
- 18 <u>implement the provisions of this section.</u>

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EXPLANATION

BY THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL

OF

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RELATING TO HUMAN SERVICES -- MEDICAL ASSISTANCE

1 This act would increase eligibility for the three (3) federal Medicare Savings Programs as 2 follows: (1) Increase to one hundred eighty-five percent (185%) of the federal poverty level for the 3 Qualified Medicare Beneficiary Program that pays for a person's Medicare Part B premium and 4 additional cost-sharing in Parts A and B; (2) Increase to two hundred percent (200%) of the federal 5 poverty level for the Specified Low Income Medicare Beneficiary Program that pays for a person's Part B premium; and (3) Increase to two hundred twenty-five percent (225%) of the federal poverty 6 level for the restricted Qualifying Individual Program that pays for a person's Part B premium. The 7 8 act would also eliminate the asset test for these programs.

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This act would take effect upon passage.

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
