HOUSE RESOLUTION

CREATING A SPECIAL LEGISLATIVE COMMISSION TO STUDY AND PROVIDE RECOMMENDATIONS PERTAINING TO SERVICES AND COORDINATION OF STATE PROGRAMS RELATING TO OLDER ADULT RHODE ISLANDERS

1 WHEREAS, Today, more than 240,000 Rhode Island residents are age 60 or older and by 2 2040, it is estimated that that figure will rise to almost 265,000, constituting an increase of nearly 3 75 percent over 30 years; and WHEREAS, A collaborative study of Rhode Island's current services and 4 5 recommendations for potential initiatives that would help residents, agencies, providers, and the government to better assist the growing population of older adults in our state achieve wellbeing 6 7 and maximum independence in ways that value, empower and engage them is essential to our State's future resilience and prosperity; now, therefore be it 8 9 RESOLVED, That a special legislative commission be and the same is hereby created consisting of sixteen (16) members: three (3) of whom shall be members of the Rhode Island 10 11 House of Representatives, not more than two (2) from the same political party, to be appointed by 12 the Speaker of the House; two (2) of whom shall be Rhode Island residents over the age of sixty-13 five (65), to be appointed by the Speaker of the House; one of whom shall be the Director of the 14 Rhode Island Department of Health (DOH), or designee; one of whom shall be the Director of the 15 Rhode Island Office of Healthy Aging, or designee; three (3) of whom shall be Directors from RI Senior Center Director's Association, to be appointed by the Speaker of the House; one of whom 16 17 shall be a Community Action Program Director from the Rhode Island Association of 18 Community Action Agencies, to be appointed by the Speaker of the House; one of whom shall be

the Director of the AARP Rhode Island, or designee; one of whom shall be a member of the RI

1	Long Term Care Coordinating Council (LTCCC), to be appointed by the Speaker of the House;
2	one of whom shall be the Executive Director of Age-Friendly RI, or designee; one of whom shall
3	be the Director of the Senior Agenda Coalition of RI; or designee; and one of whom shall be a
4	member of a Rhode Island organization representing adults with disabilities, to be appointed by
5	the Speaker of the House.
6	In lieu of any appointment of a member of the legislature to a permanent advisory
7	commission, a legislative study commission, or any commission created by a General Assembly
8	resolution, the appointing authority may appoint a member of the general public to serve in lieu
9	of a legislator.
10	The purpose of said commission shall be to make a comprehensive study of key statistics
11	and information about services for older adults in Rhode Island including, but not limited to:
12	1. Examine strengths, vulnerabilities, and demographic and financial statistics of older adult
13	Rhode Islanders;
14	2. Assess the current State, Federal and local services currently available to older adult
15	Rhode Islanders;
16	3. Examine any duplication of elderly services within the State;
17	4. Provide recommendations to institute, integrate, collaborate, and implement initiatives
18	that eliminate red tape, coordinate services within agencies, and focus on better
19	delivery of services and programs related to older adult Rhode Islanders, including
20	older adult housing options and various living arrangements, health status and
21	healthcare resources;
22	5. Provide recommendations for the creation of a portal to provide and coordinate aging
23	programs and services in the areas of employment, education, independent living,
24	accessibility and advocacy, as well as local older adult centers and services;
25	6. Provide recommendations on mental health, transportation, food access, and healthcare;
26	7. Review and provide recommendations for the funding of services through State, Federal,
27	and private grants and provide recommendations for more efficient distribution and
28	use of these dollars; and
29	8. Explore and provide recommendations for more regionalization of services.
30	Forthwith upon passage of this resolution, the members of the commission shall meet at
31	the call of the Speaker of the House and organize and shall select a chairperson from among the
32	legislators. The commission shall hold two (2) of its meetings in local communities.
33	Vacancies in said commission shall be filled in like manner as the original appointment.
34	The membership of said commission shall receive no compensation for their services.

1 All departments and agencies of the state, shall furnish such advice and information, 2 documentary and otherwise, to said commission and its agents as is deemed necessary or 3 desirable by the commission to facilitate the purposes of this resolution. 4 The Speaker of the House is hereby authorized and directed to provide suitable quarters 5 for said commission; and be it further RESOLVED, That the commission shall report its findings and recommendations to the 6 7 House of Representatives no later than May 7, 2024, and said commission shall expire on August 8 7, 2024.
