It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 36-2-1 of the General Laws in Chapter 36-2 entitled "Power of

Officers to Administer Oaths" is hereby amended to read as follows:

## 36-2-1. Officers with statewide power.

- 4 The following persons may administer oaths anywhere within the state: the governor,
- 5 lieutenant governor, secretary of state, attorney general, assistant attorneys general, general
- 6 treasurer, active magistrates and active and retired justices of the supreme, superior, family, and
- 7 district and workers' compensation courts, each member of the general assembly after he or she has
- 8 filed his or her signature with the secretary of state, commissioners appointed by other states to
- 9 take acknowledgments of deeds and depositions within this state, and notaries public.
- SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage.
