It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

- 1 SECTION 1. Chapter 16-19 of the General Laws entitled "Compulsory Attendance [See
- 2 Title 16 Chapter 97 The Rhode Island Board of Education Act]" is hereby amended by adding
- 3 thereto the following section:

- 16-19-1.2. Mental health days.
- 5 Every child subject to the compulsory attendance required by the provision of § 16-19-1
- 6 may exercise up to four (4) mental health days as a valid excuse for an absence. These mental health
- 7 days may be used similarly as students would take a sick day to address mental or behavioral health
- 8 concerns and would be recorded as excused absences.
- 9 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect on September 1, 2023.
