It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

- 1 SECTION 1. Chapter 2-15 of the General Laws entitled "Protection of Trees and Plants
- 2 Generally" is hereby amended by adding thereto the following section:
- 3 2-15-5.1. Non-native and invasive aquatic plant management and removal.
- 4 (a) The department of environmental management (DEM) shall manage freshwater non-
- 5 native and invasive aquatic plants through implementing aerial spraying, removal and other
- 6 methods, including assisting municipalities, to inhibit the growth and spread of non-native and
- 7 invasive aquatic plants and other invasive species in, along or near our freshwater waterways, lakes
- 8 <u>and ponds.</u>
- 9 (b) No damages shall be awarded to the owner for the loss or destruction of non-native or
- 10 invasive aquatic plants, or reimbursement made for expenses incurred incident to the application
- 11 of the prescribed preventive or remedial measures due to the fact that non-native or invasive aquatic
- 12 plants are a public menace.
- 13 (c) Nothing in this section shall be interpreted as preventing financial assistance to owners
- 14 where that financial assistance is provided for under specific legislation other than this title.
- 15 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage.

EXPLANATION

BY THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL

OF

AN ACT

RELATING TO AGRICULTURE AND FORESTRY -- PROTECTION OF TREES AND PLANTS GENERALLY

1 This act would allow the department of environmental management to remove freshwater 2 non-native and invasive aquatic plants and assist municipalities in preventing the growth and spread 3 of these and other invasive species in the freshwater lakes and ponds. No damages would be 4 awarded to the owner for the loss or destruction of non-native or invasive aquatic plants due to the 5 fact that those plants are declared a public menace. 6 This act would take effect upon passage.
