St. Patrick Day Celebration – State House – March 14, 2019

Good afternoon Speaker Mattiello, Dear Senators and Representatives of our beloved state, and Honorable Guests – On behalf of Bishop Tobin, Bishop Evans our Auxiliary Bishop, and Monsignor Kenney the Vicar-General of the Diocese, I extend best wishes and gratitude for the kind invitation to join you today.

It's been observed that our hectic society is increasingly less able to dialogue. True dialogue . . . without using social media or our smartphones. And for that reason, and for many other ones sadly, we find it more challenging to share what truly unites us. Faith and tradition. And certainly events like this one that celebrate both of those pillars of our identity.

Faith and Tradition are very much relevant, and have demonstrated that we are somehow hard-wired for Faith and Tradition - much as modern society tries to deny it. Deep down, we can't resist their beauty, mystery and allure.

Faith. Tradition. These words are on the "endangered species list" in our secularized world. Yet, by what we commemorate today, again we assert their relevance and power for our lives. We know somehow that we *need* them. In the present day, and for our beloved state, with all of the challenges, problems, and sorrows of our people, but also the joys and victories.

We gather to celebrate the same Faith and Tradition that have given us the feast of St. Patrick.
