Mr. Speaker:

I hereby move to amend 2021 -- S 0062 SUBSTITUTE A, AS AMENDED, entitled "AN ACT RELATING TO BUSINESSES AND PROFESSIONS -- CONFIDENTIALITY OF HEALTH CARE COMMUNICATIONS AND INFORMATION ACT", as follows:

1. By deleting all language after the enactment clause and by inserting in place thereof the following language:

"SECTION 1. Chapter 5-37.3 of the General Laws entitled "Confidentiality of Health Care Communications and Information Act" is hereby amended by adding thereto the following section:

5-37.3-12. Right to confidential communication of confidential health care information.

(a) As used in this section:

(1) "Confidential communications request" means a request by a insured individual or authorized representative covered under a health insurance policy that insurance communications containing confidential health care information be communicated to him or her at a specific mail or email address or specific telephone number, as designated by the insured individual or authorized representative.

(2) "Confidential health care information" shall have the same meaning as set forth in § 5-37.3-3.

(3) "Health insurer" shall have the same meaning as "managed-care entity" as defined in § 5-37.3-3.

(4) "Health care provider" shall have the same meaning as set forth in § 5-37.3-3.

(5) "Insured individual" means a covered individual under the policy and legally capable of consenting to the provisions of covered benefits.

(6) "Patient or authorized representative" shall have the same meaning as set forth in § 5-37.3-3.

(b) Notwithstanding any other law, and to the extent permitted by federal law, a health insurer shall take the following steps to further protect the confidentiality of an insured individual's confidential health care information:

(1) A health insurer shall permit an insured individual or authorized representative to submit a confidential communications request form as described in subsection (d) of this section. A health insurer

shall accommodate requests for communication in the form and format requested by the insured individual or authorized representative, if it is readily producible in the requested form and format. A health insurer shall permit that communications containing confidential health care information be communicated to the insured individual or authorized representative at a specific mail or email address or specific telephone number, as designated by the insured individual or authorized representative.

(2) A health insurer may require the insured individual or authorized representative to make a request for a confidential communication described in subsection (b)(1) of this section, in writing or by electronic transmission.

(3) The confidential communication request shall be valid until the insured individual or authorized representative submits a revocation of the request, or a new confidential communication request is submitted.

(4) For the purposes of this section, a confidential communications request must be implemented by the health insurer within ten (10) calendar days of the receipt of an electronic transmission or telephonic request or within ten (10) calendar days of receipt by first-class mail. The health insurer shall acknowledge receipt of the confidential communications request and advise the insured individual or authorized representative of the status of implementation of the request if an insured individual or authorized representative contacts the insurer.

(c) A health insurer shall not condition coverage on the waiver of rights provided in this section.

(d) All health insurers shall create a confidential communications request form that shall be easily readable and prominently displayed on the health insurer’s website.

(e) The department of health shall develop and disseminate to health care providers information on best practices relating to how providers can support insured individuals or authorized representatives requesting confidential communications including, but not limited to:

(1) Ensuring that health care providers and health care staff are aware and understand the requirements outlined in this section;

(2) Having hard-copy versions of the standardized confidential communications request form described in subsection (d) of this section, prominently displayed and available to insured individuals or authorized representatives; and

(3) Offering to submit the standardized confidential communications request form described in subsection (d) of this section that has been completed by an insured individual or authorized representative to that insured individual's health insurer.

(f) The office of the health insurance commissioner and the department of health may adopt reasonable rules and regulations for the implementation and administration of this chapter.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect on January 1, 2022."

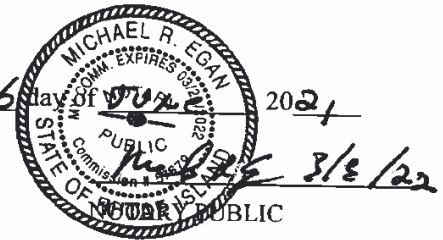

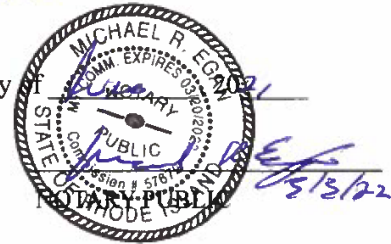

TO THE HONORABLE, THE SPEAKER OF THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES:

In accordance with the provisions of Article IX, Section 14 of the Constitution of the State of Rhode Island and Section 43-1-4 of the Rhode Island General Laws, I transmit, with my disapproval, 2021-H5505A – “An Act Relating to State Affairs and Government – Tourism and Development.”

This legislation would require the Department of Business Regulation (DBR) to create and maintain an online registration database for all short-term rental properties that are listed on hosting platforms (STRs). All Rhode Island property owners who rent their property on a short-term basis would be obligated to register with DBR. This registration would be in addition to the existing STR operator registration requirements with the Division of Taxation as well as any city/town registration requirements by local ordinance.

I cannot support this bill because it will create additional burden for property owners. Short-term rental concerns, like other property/land use and small business matters, are most effectively addressed at the municipal level. Our local planning, zoning, and building authorities have the requisite experience and expertise to determine what works (or does not work) for their community. Furthermore, Rhode Island already requires short-term rentals to register with the Division of Taxation, which requirement our neighboring states share, without calling for a second state registration; in both Massachusetts and Connecticut, however, some municipalities also have local registrations and/or restrictions.

We would be happy to work with the municipalities to help identify registration portals that could improve and streamline any existing STR registration process.

TO THE HONORABLE, THE SPEAKER OF THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES:

In accordance with the provisions of Article IX, Section 14 of the Constitution of the State of Rhode Island and Section 43-1-4 of the Rhode Island General Laws, I transmit, with my disapproval, 2021-H6324 – “An Act Relating to Insurance – Unfair Claims Settlement Practices Act”

This legislation would add language to three sections of the Insurance Unfair Claims Settlement Practices Act. While I recognize the stated intent of this bill is to protect consumers, and there are portions of this legislation that I could support, overall the legislation will add costs without adding commensurate benefits to consumers.

The legislation would add two types of costs (“markup” and “sublet services”) that insurers would be required to pay to auto body shops when repairing a vehicle covered by insurance. Neither of these terms are defined and there are no clear limitations of when those costs might be appropriate.

According to the National Association of Insurance Commissioners, Rhode Island ranks 7th in the nation for highest auto insurance premiums. As we look to restart our economy after the pandemic, we cannot implement measures that may drive costs even higher for consumers and small businesses. Our focus must be reducing costs to help our economy grow.

Now is the time to identify what is driving the rising cost of auto body repair and insurance premiums in Rhode Island, including the role insurance companies can play in lowering rates. I remain committed to working with all Rhode Island businesses, including auto body shops. I am open to working with Legislators on language that would address the remaining issues in the legislation such as industry software and the salvage vehicle process.
