RELATING TO HEALTH AND SAFETY -- COMMISSION ON THE DEAF AND HARD-OF-HEARING

It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 23-1.8 of the General Laws entitled "Commission on the Deaf and
2 Hard-of-Hearing" is hereby amended by adding thereto the following section:

3 **23-1.8-5. Communication access services.**

4 A state employee who is approved by the commission for the deaf and hard of hearing as
5 an interpreter or a communication access realtime translation (CART) provider may be employed
6 by the commission or by other state agencies as long as the interpreter and CART services:

7 (1) Are provided outside of the normal working hours of the employee in order to comply
8 with federal, state, and local laws;

9 (2) The services are not required as part of the regular duties of the employee;

10 (3) The employee does not participate in or have official responsibility for the financial
11 management of the contracting agency;

12 (4) The employee is compensated for no more than four (4) hours in any day in which the
13 employee is otherwise compensated by the state of Rhode Island; and

14 (5) The head of the contracting agency files with the state ethics commission a written
15 certification that there is a critical need for the services of the employee.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage.
